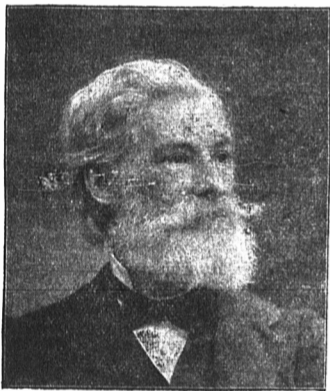

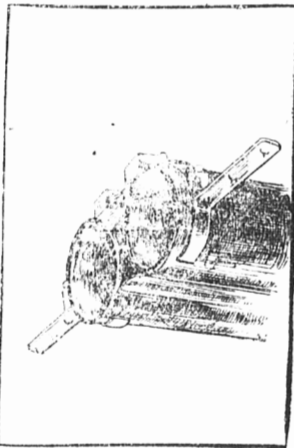

IMPROVED GUN SIGHT.

This is due to the difference in the speed of the two birds in flight.
