JUDGE DAVIES.

Sir Louis Davies was formally appointed a Judge of the Supreme Court of Canada at a Cabinet meeting held on Saturday last. He thus secures a life position with a salary of \$7,000. His rise has been rapid. Born in 1845, he was called to the bar at 21 years of age, was elected to the House of Assembly and became leader of the Opposition at 27 and Premier and Attorney General at 31. He was knighted at 32 and now at the comparatively early age of 56 and while still in the prime of manhood he completes a long and arduous political career and becomes a Judge of the highest Court in Canada. In his new position he holds the distinction of being the first to bring to the Court the honor of Knighthood previously obtained. In the case of other Judges of that Court Knighthood had sometimes followed, but had not preceded their elevation.

THE GUARDIAN most heartily congratulates Judge Davies on his appointment. We believe that he will prove a just, capable and painstaking Judge, and that in his new position, as in all that he has previously held he will reflect honor upon his native Island.

Much comment has been made upon recent British losses in South Africa, some 250 men in one week. It turns out that the guns which were first disabled by destroying the sights and breech-blocks, so that they will be useless to the Boers. The British prisoners have also since been released by the enemy. And in the same week the British forces killed, wounded and captured over 500 Boers, so that the balance of success is largely on our side.

CHINA'S COAL SUPPLY.

It is estimated that the known coal fields of the Chinese Empire cover the enormous area of 400,000 square miles, while the "black diamond wealth of Britain," to which we owe our position as "the workshop of the world," is not over 12,000 square miles, or some thirty-three times less than that of the Celestial Empire. The deposits in Shan-si and the south-east alone cover about 14,000 square miles. It is estimated that the quantity of fuel waiting to be mined is six hundred and thirty thousand million tons.

ANNUAL BRITISH LOAF

The annual British loaf, which weighs considerably over 7,000,000 tons, contains rather over 1,015,000,000 cubic feet of staff of life; that is to say, if turned out having the width and length of the ordinary loaf—i.e., 6 1/2 inches high and 4 1/2 inches wide, it would give length 937,895 miles, which would give every man, woman, and child in the kingdom a daily ration rather less than four inches long, or in aggregate, a daily loaf (2,567 miles in length) extending from London to 300 miles beyond Mount Ararat in to the heart of the continent owing allegiance to the Shah. If baked in the form of a biscuit or cake a quarter of an inch in thickness the area of the same would amount to over 1,119,000 acres, and if baked in a circular form would entail a walk of 148 miles to circumscribe it.

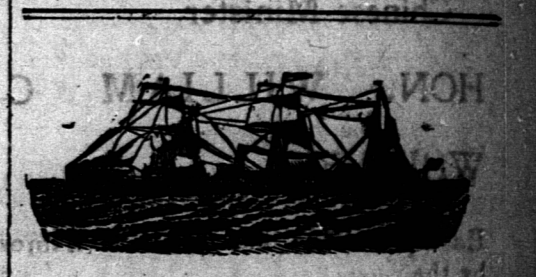
