On Saturday evening in the Assembly Hall of Prince of Wales College W. Albert Hickman the Author of "The Sacrifice of the Shannon" is to give an illustrated lecture before the Summer School of Science on "Some Aspects of Canadian Geography; and their relation to Imperial connection." The lecture is open to the public. The lantern slides used are from photographs taken by Mr. Hickman and illustrate every type of country between Atlantic and Pacific, from the Maritime Provinces to Vancouver Island, many of them are colored, and were painted in oils by one of the best known slide colorists in Great Britain. It was these slides that the London Times referred to as "among the finest pictures illustrative of the conditions of life in a colony, ever brought to Great Britain." Mr. Hickman has recently lectured in the United Kingdom to audiences which comprised nearly a hundred thousand people and has had among his chairmen many distinguished men, including the Duke of Argyll, the Earl of Derby, the Earl of Aberdeen, Lord Strathcona and many others as well known to Canadians. Of Mr. Hickman as a lecturer chairman and press alike have been complimentary.
