**Conservatives Caught Off Base On Budget Vote**

OTTAWA, Nov. 12 — (CP) — Caught by a surprise end to the 1949-50 budget debate, the Progressive Conservatives today missed a chance to force a vote on their budget amendment.

A combination of circumstances — not the least of which was the broadcast of the Montreal-Ottawa big four football playoff—contributed to the situation.

The result was that the few Progressive Conservatives in the Commons at the time didn't think of rising to force a formal vote on their amendment.

The amendment asked that: "This House regret that the government has failed to take effective measures to prevent the present decline in our trade with the sterling area and is of the opinion that the government should consider the advisability of inviting the ratifiers of the commonwealth to a conference in the immediate future for the purpose of working out arrangements to preserve and enlarge those traditional markets on which jobs and opportunities for Canadians very largely depend."

It was obvious that no one among the Progressive Conservatives expected the budget debate to finish today.

George Drew, Progressive Conservative leader, was in his office writing a speech for delivery in the debate when it ended abruptly.

Mr. Drew came rushing to his seat shortly after deputy speaker Alfred Dion had declared the amendment lost on a voice vote in which he called for the members to indicate their feelings by "yeas" and "nays."

**Too Little, Too Late**

It was at this point that the Progressive Conservatives could have risen, indicating they wanted a formally-recorded vote. Five members must rise to force a vote.

There were about eight Progressive Conservatives in their seats at the time but none thought of asking for the vote.

Fewer than 100 of the 262 members were in the House at the time. Many were out listening to the football broadcast.

The amendment was the second introduced in the budget debate.

Previously the House had voted 169 to 19 against a C.C.F. want-of-confidence motion urging tariff reduction to encourage imports from the United Kingdom and other sterling area countries.

After the main budget motion was adopted the Commons began detailed study of the taxation legislation.

The former financial expert of the Progressive Conservative party — J. M. Macdonnell—returned to Parliament today.

Defeated in the June 27 election in Parry Sound-Muskoka, Mr. Macdonnell recently won the Toronto Greenwood by-election.

At house opening, Transport Minister Chevrier, replying to a question asked by J. Watson MacNaught (L—Prince) said the Canadian National Railways is taking steps to overcome the shortage of refrigerator cars in Prince Edward Island.
