Then I passed them around to be admired. After they had all seen them, Everett rose, and coming to me clasped them about my neck, at which they all exclaimed over their becomingness.

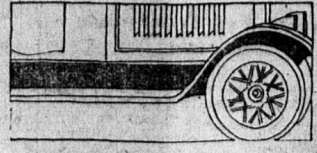

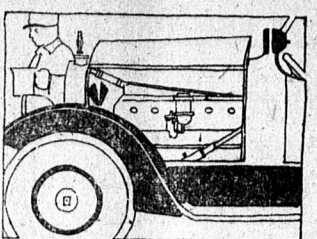
BROKEN SPOKES IN WIRE WHEELS



L. E. S. writes: I find that the spokes of the wire wheels on my car have begun to rust badly and that several have broken close to the hub. Is there danger in running them longer?

Answer: They will bear very close watching, especially the front wheels, for more spokes are likely to give way soon. However, the factor of safety in these wheels is liberal, and the chance of sudden collapse is not great. If your spare wheel is in good condition, why don't you put it on in place of the worst wheel, sending the latter away for repairs and treating the others similarly as soon as possible?

WANTS TO ADVANCE

R. D. McA. asks: What can you tell me about the method of decarbonizing engines, which consists of injecting water into the intake through a primer or otherwise when the engine is hot?

Answer: It seems to be pretty generally agreed that this method is of value and in cases in which we have seen it applied there was quite a considerable amount of carbon thrown out through the exhaust after the water had been applied. A suction primer, fed with water, is apparently a very good device to use in this connection.



J. F. R. writes: I am a young man employed as a helper in a large plumbing establishment and, as my outlook for advancement here is not very brilliant I have decided to try to enter the automobile business. Can you advise me how to proceed to fit myself as an expert automobile repairer?

AUTOMATIC SPARK TIMING

L. B. C. asks: Does the use of the automatic spark advance remove all danger to an engine from too early ignition?

Answer: Not absolutely but practically speaking it can be made to do so. If the timing is so set that with the ignition-lever fully advanced, the spark does not occur earlier than dead center, there is no danger from early ignition assuming that the rate of automatic advance is adapted to the particular engine in question.

W. C. T. U. HAS TAKEN UP TOBACCO

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 19.—An intensive worldwide campaign to teach "the bad effects of health of alcohol and tobacco" was advocated at the Victory Convention of the National Women's Christian Temperance Union which opened here today.

Speakers denied prohibition was responsible for the labor unrest, and emphasized that it was due to it that the strikes were virtually devoid of violence. The women pledged themselves to seek out violators of the dry law and report them to the Federal authorities.

Mrs. Anna A. Gordon, of Evanston, Ill., President of the organization, recommended that the organization conduct six regional conferences in 1920 to discuss constructive plans, establish a training school for prohibition workers at Evanston, Ill., and open an Americanization centre in New York.
