THE FERRY BILL IN COMMITTEE

The Preamble Adopted and the Bill Postponed

ISLAND MEMBERS DIVIDE

McKinnon Favors, Hughes, Lefurgey and Hackett Oppose it—Emmerson, Fielding Give Support—Bad Storm.

MR. EMMERSON AND THE CAPE FERRY.

OTTAWA, July 28—(Special)—The Railway Committee today considered the P. E. Island ferry bill.

Mr. Emmerson did not see why the Company should be prevented from spending its capital in the manner indicated. Besides the ferry, he said the Company intended building several branch railways in New Brunswick.

SOME ISLAND MEMBERS OPPOSED.

Messrs. Hughes, Lefurgey and Hackett favored the bill, while Mr. McKinnon opposed the establishment of a service at the Capes.

MR. FIELDING IN ITS FAVOR.

Hon. Mr. Fielding did not see that the bill would interfere in any way with the obligations of the Government. If he did he would vote against it.

MR. HUGHES IN OPPOSITION.

Mr. Hughes said the Uniglecto ship railway scheme was more feasible than the present one.

PREAMBLE ADOPTED BILL POSTPONED.

The preamble of the bill was adopted on a vote of 18 to 13, but objection was taken to the lack of a proper map and the further consideration was postponed.

BATHURST, July 28.—(Special)—A heavy north to northeast gale accompanied by torrents of rain continued into the night.

Borell's comet has been plainly visible for the past few weeks, but lately the evening sky has been so cloudy that there have been but few opportunities for stargazing. Last night, however, was comparatively favorable and many persons saw the comet. It may be located in several ways. Beginning at the north star look southwest until in a line with Pegasus and Andromeda the fourth and fifth stars of the dipper and the comet will be seen as quite a large patch of light. On taking a line from the first star in the handle of the dipper to the nearest one in the bowl as a base, the apex of the small triangle thus formed will be the comet. It can be easily distinguished with the naked eye, but a good pair of glasses bring out the tail much more plainly.

SUMMER SCHOOL OF SCIENCE

The Work Continues to Grow in Interest

The First Excursion of the School Held on Saturday—The Guardian Correspondent Writes Entertainingly.

(BY THE GUARDIAN CORRESPONDENT.)

CHATHAM, July 28.—The work of the Summer School continues to grow in interest and numbers. Its location for this year is the reason for this. It would be difficult to find a place combining more scientific, picturesque, and historical points of interest than does Chatham situated as it is on the Miramichi, about forty miles from its mouth.

The first public lecture of the course was given on Thursday evening, the 23rd inst. A. Melville Scott, Ph. D., of the University of New Brunswick, lectured on "Wireless Telegraphy," illustrating his lecture by the sending and receiving of messages.

After a brief historical sketch of the experiments made in sending messages by electricity, without wires to conduct the electric fluid, the lecturer explained the principles of the three methods that has up to the present been adopted for sending messages, without wires, viz., by conduction, induction, and the Hertz waves, or as it is now properly known as the Marconi system.

Electricity, its nature and action was then described although the lecturer admitted that very little was known as to what electricity really was. We see and note its effects and action, but what it is we are yet at a loss to definitely determine.

The sending and receiving instruments of the Marconi system were then described, the lecturer having an instrument of each kind with him, and messages were sent from the one and received by the other at a very considerable distance from each other.

The lecture was entirely devoid of the technicalities usually employed by those who talk on the public platform on scientific subjects, but was expressed in clear forceful language within the comprehension of all whether professional or not. All felt that in the lecture they had received an comprehensible idea of a subject that had hitherto been to them most mysterious.

Friday, the 24th being rainy instead of the Field work Dr. Scott of Fredericton entertained the school in the afternoon with a recital of several legends of the Rhine.

In the evening J. Vroom, Esq., lectured taking for his subject Winter and how the trees and other plants prepare for it. Saturday, the 25th was the first excursion of the school leaving at nine o'clock a. m., going down the Miramichi to Church Point. Spending a delightful day they returned to Chatham at six p. m.
