In a trial spin yesterday morning at the C. A. A. grounds the Brown Bros. covered a half mile in 1.06 which is faster than the Maritime record. Newsome did a quarter flying start in 32 seconds which is equal to the M. P. record for the distance. Several other bicyclists have been going "against the watch" but they are reticent about the time made. It is confidently expected that new records will be made in some of the bicycle events and also in the 440 yds run in which there are six entries. Macmillan the Maritime champion will start scratch in this event.

The medals and other prizes for the sports have been received and will be on exhibition in the Apothecaries Hall window this evening.
