In referring to gifts to universities the Halifax Herald says: Harvard has received in gifts during the past year over \$1,750,000. Yale, Chicago and other institutions have also had rich donations to acknowledge. McGill is being generously treated by a P. E. Islander, who has grown rich in a Canadian business. We have in our midst a university that is doing as good work as any of them in its own field. How is it that our people seem devoid of the spirit that prompts gifts to institutions of learning? If some one would have the generous courage to make a start among us in the good and much needed work, it is likely that others would follow the worthy example.

The alliance of party with the liquor men has been fraught with the same results in the neighboring Republic as in every other instance where the same course has been pursued. A Boston exchange in dealing with the matter contends that if the Republicans keep to their present announced position to enforce the liquor law in the cities of Maine there may be something of a Democratic revival in the voting of that state. The Republicans have for several years practically annihilated the Democratic party in Maine. They have done this by adding to their own strength that of the liquor dealers. It has been understood that the liquor dealers by omitting to be against the Republicans in politics indeed, in many cases giving their influence to Republican tickets were to be exempt from prosecution, so leniently that it was practicable for them to pay their fines and still carry on business. All this under the most recent declaration is now to be brought to an end and the Republican alliance with liquor dealers to be declared off. It is expected to send many Democrats back to their party in the voting, and perhaps to add some Republicans to their number.

For some time past reports have been received at the Fisheries Department that American and Canadian fishermen have been in the habit of dynamiting fish on Old Proprietor Ledge, off Grand Manan, New Brunswick, and some correspondence has taken place with the home authorities on the subject of these encroachments by American fishermen. It is understood that the terms of the Canadian despatch have been communicated to the authorities at Washington conveying the intimation that the Dominion does not propose to allow these illegal practices to be continued off Grand Manan, neither by towns-people or by the American fishermen. Any person found dynamiting fish in Canadian waters hereafter, will be punished with the utmost severity and either boats or vessels seized. The despatch points out, moreover, that American fishermen have no rights within the three mile limit off Grand Manan, as some of them have assumed they possessed. The action of the Government in this regard is praiseworthy as the dynamiting of fish has been found to be very disastrous, in fact the ultimate extermination of one of the chief sources of revenue of the Dominion of Canada.

A BREADPUL EXPERIENCE.
