A SUITABLE IMMIGRANT.

The last vestige of nationality and
liberty has been taken from the unfortun-
ate Finlanders. The three years of oppres-
sion and violation of the rights of the
Grand Duchy solemnly guaranteed by the
predecessor of the present Czar has ended
in the sole way it was intended to
and now the decree that St. Petersburg
will rule in all matters of law goes into
operation. For a century, says a recent
Free Press, the national Legislature has
provided a genuine "home rule" for the
nation, the National Assembly consisting
of four estates, the nobles, clergy and
burghers and peasants, enacting all laws
and preserving the constitution or alter-
ing it as deemed desirable and expedient
and absolutely controlling the taxation
and financial affairs of the Grand Duchy.
Now the new decrees remove all the
control of such matters to St. Petersburg,
barely the pretence of self-government
being left. More than that the military
service has been removed from the con-
trol, as formerly, of the Finns themselves.
Under that control the soldiers of the
nationality were noted for their loyalty
and fidelity, the Finnish Guard being the
personal troop of the Czars, the tyrants
apparently being fearful of the men of
their own race. In vain has the Diet
combated the change as a violation of
compact and constitution alike. Today
the Finns find themselves under a Gov-
ernor General who is to preside in person
or by deputy in the sessions of the Diet
with power by a word to veto any law
passed or projected. The judiciary,
hitherto an independent and trusted
body, hereafter is to serve under the
supervision of the Imperial Government
and be liable to instant removal by the
Czar or his representative. And no
action is to be initiated without permis-
sion first being obtained from the Gov-
ernor General and to put the capstone on
the pyramid of oppression raised, the
national language is not to be used, but
Russian.

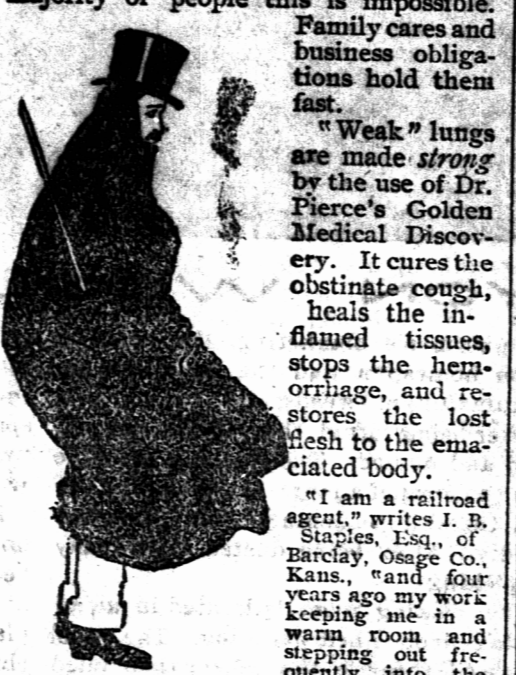
All of which is in direct violation of
the solemn treaty pledge given in 1809
and a condition of affairs under which
Finland has prospered and been the bright-
est jewel in the muscovite diadem. The
action of the Russians is inexplicable.
They are creating another Poland and in
the place of a loyal contented people they
will have to deal with an oppressed and
wronged population burning under a sense
of injustice. The intense feeling that has
been kindled will now be perpetuated as
the hope which appears to have long
been cherished by the Finns that their
appeals for justice would be heeded,
appears now to be succeeded by an angry
despair, and as far as they are permitted
to give expression to their sentiments it
is evident that a large majority of the
population will not tolerate the new re-
gime. The final obliteration, with-
out hope of liberties and rights, will, it
is to be gathered from statements by
leading Finns at Helsingfors and else-
where, which appear in Scandinavian
papers, be followed by a wholesale emi-
gration. Resistance is out of the question
submission it seems impossible. It is to
be hoped our Department of the Interior
will not permit so golden an opportunity
of obtaining a class of immigrant equal
to the Scandinavians as settlers to pass
without making an effort to direct the
tide of emigration this way. Direct work
by Canadian agents in Finland would be
