FIRE IN SPRINGHILL BUSINESS BLOCK.

SPRINGHILL MINES, June 21.—Fire this morning in a business block on the south side of Main Street, owned by Mrs. C.M. Sprague, did more than \$3,000 damage to the building, and a proportionately large amount of damage to the stock and fittings of the tenement. The fire started on the south side of an ell between the main building and Mrs. Sprague's residence. Its cause is undetermined, but Mr. McLean, photographer, who first noticed it from a window of his studio in the building, is of the opinion that sparks from nearby chimneys lighting in the rubbish collected by nesting birds in a place where a clapboard had become displaced, was the cause. Mr. McLean attempted to fight the fire alone, but it got too big for him and an alarm of fire was sent in to the town apparatus, and the fire brigade of the Coal Commission were quickly at hand, and had the fire subdued within an hour.

McLean, photographer; Anderson, jeweller; F. Casey, barber; R. McDonald, confectioner; J.R. Forbes, tailor; H. S. Terris, insurance agent and near parts of the block were sufferers from fire, smoke and water. The losses on the buildings and the stock of nearly all the tenants is covered by insurance. A fresh breeze was blowing when the fire started and but for prompt action by the fire fighting forces, a great part of the town's business district would have been endangered. The firemen were aided by ample water pressure from the Gravity Reservoir.
