Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entries by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency, but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. DATES—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. Homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required in each where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. DUES—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent also 50 acres of land cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. DUES—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction if land is rough, scrubby or stony and. Live stock may be submitted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. CORY, C.M.G. 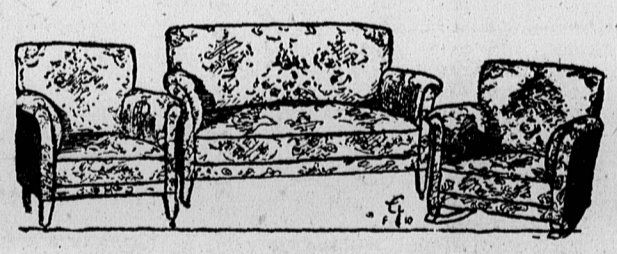

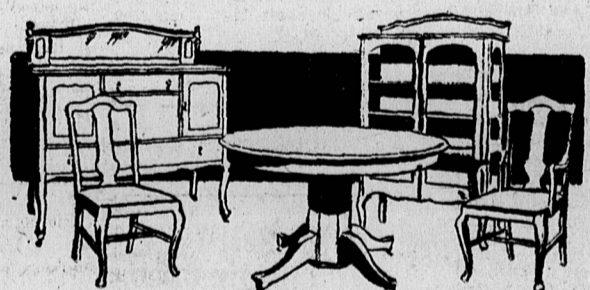
