Shipping News The Halifax Chronicle says: Charles N. Delatte, assistant manager of the Winnisimmet Shipyards, of Chelsea, Mass., arrived in the city Saturday. Mr. Delatte is here to look over the advantages of branch of the Winnisimmet Yards. Speaking to a Chronicle reporter at the Halifax Hotel, Mr. Delatte was already enthusiastic over the possibilities of Halifax harbor from a shipbuilders' standpoint. He has already paid a visit to St. John, but is not probable that the shipyards will locate there. The restriction placed by the American Government on wooden ships has forced the Winnisimmet Shipyards, to steel shipbuilding; at present at their yards there are thirty-five wooden vessels under repair and twelve hundred men are employed there. There are two small marine railways, and a large four thousand ton railway is under construction at the Chelsea yards. The plant, if located in Halifax will construct wooden ships of all classes.

SHIPPING BRISK IN ST. JOHN An exchange says: St. John harbor is crowded with shipping. Every berth is used and many steamers are lying in the stream. Next winter the conditions will be even worse unless something is done about increased accommodation.
