**B. A. ACT PASSED
 BRITISH HOUSE**

**Parliament Declined to Interfere With
 Ottawa Conference of Premiers and
 the resolutions Passed by the
 Canadian House—Churchill
 Was Cheered**

LONDON, June 14.—Yesterday Winston Churchill introduced the British North America Act of 1907, containing the essential propositions of the resolution of the Premier at the Ottawa Conference last autumn. The new scale of the Federal subsidies is confirmed, but the words "final and unalterable" are omitted, because an Act of the British Parliament is final. There was no opposition and the bill passed its first reading.

Premier McBride, of British Columbia, had many interviews with the Colonial Office about the inadequacy of his grant. Mr. McBride made great impressions and was complimented by Winston Churchill and Hon. A. Lytton, who, with the authorities declined to interfere with the substance of the Ottawa Conference, and the Dominion Parliament resolutions, but declined to lay down the rule that the opinion of the Federal Government is necessarily final.

Attorney General Fox, of Ontario, Campbell, of Manitoba, and Premier McBride, were in the gallery during the debate.

**HAWAIIAN JAPS
 ARE UP IN ARMS**

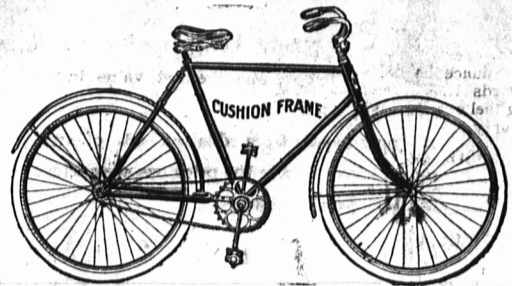
HONOLULU, June 11.—The Japanese merchants, hotelkeepers, shopkeepers and artisans, in fact all Japanese, except laborers, are getting up a petition to President Roosevelt, asking him to rescind the order he has made prohibiting the immigration of Japanese from Hawaii to the mainland of the United States. They claim the order is in violation of their treaty rights; that the Japanese here ought not to be made to suffer for any wrongs their countrymen may have done on the mainland.

They insist if the Japanese residents of Hawaii can be shut out of any other part of the country, the people of any state can be prohibited from going to any other in search of better wages or a better market.
