FRENCH ARE IN FEAR OF 'YELLOW PERIL'

France Advised to Assist Russia in the Far East to Crush Japan.

The official report made by the Governor General of French Indo-China, that the Chinese government is organizing a vast modern army, which, in a few years, will number more than a million men, has caused great anxiety. Never has the "yellow peril" been more widely discussed than now. Leading men of all parties are strongly advising that France actively assist her ally, Russia, in the Far East to crush Japan, on the ground that the latter's power is endangering the world's peace. "France could render no greater service to the world than by sending out a strong squadron to co-operate with Admiral Rojestvensky," says a prominent French leader. "Sooner or later we shall have to fight the Japanese in self-defense, and it would be better if these yellow upstarts were crushed now, than to have them choose their own time for attacking us. If Europe and America continue to sympathize with and help Japan, Russia may be hopelessly defeated, and we shall then have peace for just exactly the time that Japan requires to thoroughly organize the millions of China. 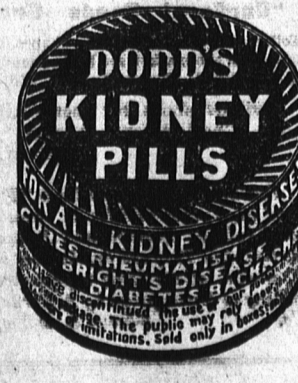

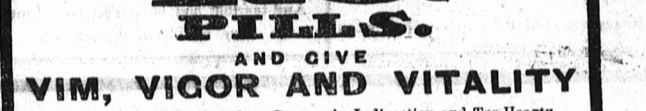
