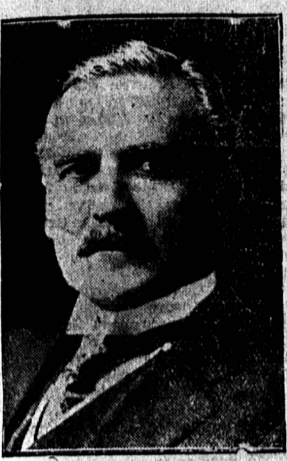

BROOKLYN HAS \$500,000 FIRE

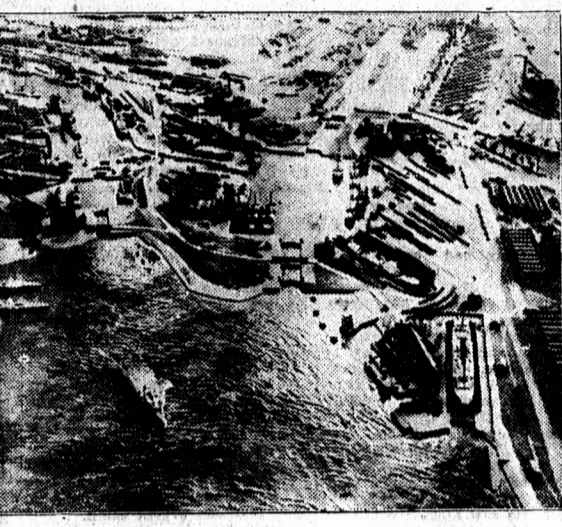

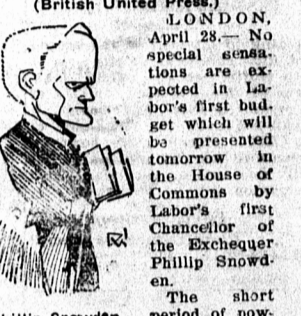

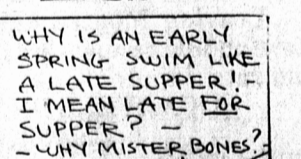
