

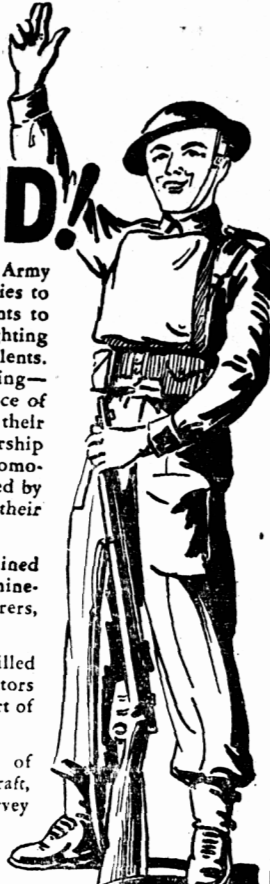
High School Students WANTED!

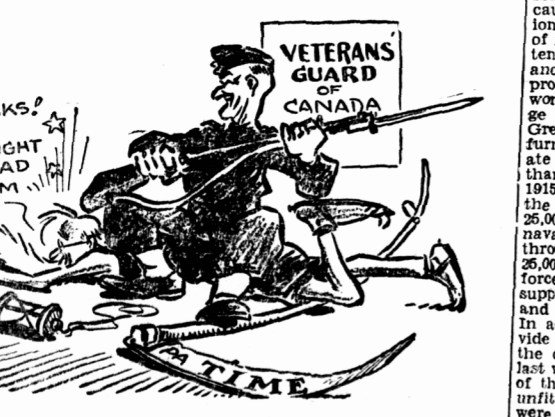
