BRITISH OFFICERS WHIPPED ON THEIR BARE BACKS WITH CANES

The state of Affairs Revealed Since Dismissal of Col. Kinloch from Command of the Grenadier Guards is Most Debated Question in England Promises to Furnish Keener and More Closely Watched Discussions Than Any Question of Home or Foreign Politics.

LONDON, February, 17.—The latest revelations of the extent to which hazing has been practiced in the Grenadier Guards have shocked society, and thrown army circles into a fever of excitement. On all sides it is considered to be the most severe blow the morale of the army has received for years.

Despatches have described how three young officers of the Grenadier Guards—the Marquis of Dour, son of the Duke of Wellington, himself formerly colonel of this regiment; the master of Belhaven, Lord Belhaven's son, and Lieutenant Lavesson Gower—were disgracefully bullied and beaten by their fellows for alleged offences which did not call for punishment at their hands.

These charges against the young officers aroused their relatives and friends, who knew the circumstances and yesterday in the Times, Rear Admiral Basil E. Cochrane describes the system of "hazing" which prevailed in the Grenadiers, and which has set all London by the ears.

It is the custom for these court martial to be summoned by the senior subaltern. The court consists of a president and two members—the attendance of all the other subalterns being exacted. In the First Battalion of the Grenadiers the Colonel was in the habit of handing over the young officers to be dealt with by the senior subaltern, which nearly always resulted in their being sentenced by this irregular tribunal to be flogged.

What greatly added to the inhumanity of these proceedings was that all the officers present were compelled to administer that share of the strokes, if the numbers permitted, and their comrades were obliged to apply blows to their own personal friends, under threats of receiving similar punishment themselves.

Rear Admiral Cochrane tells how his nephew, instead of going in for social diversions after joining the Grenadier Guards upon graduation at Oxford, studied assiduously military topics, particularly signalling, to such good purpose that he was appointed acting chief signalling officer for the home district. He carried out all the signalling arrangements for the royal procession on October 25.

COLONEL HANDED HIM OVER. "After two days' absence Colonel Kinloch recalled him by telegram and severely reprimanded him for being absent without leave, refusing to recognize the leave he obtained from the chief of staff officer as mitigation.

"When brought before the subalterns' court martial the president told him that he had been handed over by the commanding officer and sentenced to be beaten. Unusual consideration was displayed in his case, as he was not subjected to the degrading removal of his dress and the blows which he received were of no excessive severity.

"My nephew appealed to General Trotter, commanding the home district who, however, upheld Colonel Kinloch's action and deprived my nephew of his post of acting district signalling officer. Shortly afterward my nephew, and two of the other subalterns were brought before the senior subalterns who told them that unless they rode with the brigade next at Windsor they would be flogged.

u chief. "He drew up a paper which he judged to be justified under such very exceptional circumstances. This paper was to be sent through the colonel of the battalion, but before this could be done information of it was given to the regiment's colonel. He pronounced it to be mutiny.

APPEALED TO LORD ROBERTS. "This officer, Colonel Ricardo, then accused my nephew of felling barefaced lies and of inciting his brother ensigns to mutiny, said he would have to leave the regiment. "Colonel Ricardo wrote to the same effect to another of my nephew's relatives, who immediately brought the case before Lord Roberts and demanded protection for an innocent officer who was to be turned out of his regiment in order to teach the subalterns the futility of protesting against the traditional system of subalterns' court martialing and flogging.

Despite this promise of "protection" my nephew was on January 16 placed under arrest for doing what according to the opinion of a military expert was perfectly proper. He was also given to understand he must leave the regiment. In fact, threats were used to that effect.

"I made an appeal to Lord Roberts for a revision of the sentence passed upon my nephew, but without success. My nephew therefore resigned his commission on Friday.

Unmoved by the sensation his letter has created, Admiral Cochrane sticks to his guns and refuses to take back a word of what he wrote. "Last night he said: "These fellows have been going on for years. They are most disgraceful. I hope, I wish and believe that this exposure will put an end to them.

"With regard to the flogging which my nephew underwent, it was inflicted for the most trifling cause. The son of the Duke of Wellington was flogged because he left the Wellington barracks in undress uniform to get his hair cut. To have one's hair cut while wearing a uniform of any kind is considered to be a breach of regimental etiquette, except when the officer is actually on duty.

Another officer was flogged for omitting to attend the regimental court martial. One subaltern was flogged because he became engaged and another because he dined with certain ladies at a hotel.
