### GREAT PROJECTED MARITIME WORKS

Strike a circle of seventy miles diameter with its centre at Cape Tormentine and within its bounds will be found the important towns of Amherst, Spring Hill, Dorchester, Sackville, Shediac, Charlottetown and Summerside, nearly half the population of Prince Edward Island and half the great counties of Cumberland, N. S. and Westmoreland, N. B. It is an area rich in coal, in oil, in agricultural lands and fisheries. It includes the site also of the telegraph cable connecting the Island and the Mainland.

Within this circle also is the proposed location of three important public projects, which at various times have engaged a great deal of public attention. These are the Bale Verte Canal, the Chignecto Ship Railway and the Tunnel. The Bale Verte Canal was projected and surveyed by the Imperial Government in 1825 as a measure for naval defence. It was much talked of at Confederation as a work of great importance to the Maritime Provinces, but later dropped out of notice and another project took its place.

This second project, the Chignecto Ship Railway, was designed to take the place of the proposed canal and carry ships across the isthmus by rail supported on cradles. A company was chartered on the subsidy plan, the Ottawa Government to pay so much a year for twenty years after the work was in operation. The line was graded and four lines of 120 pound rails, laid all the way across the isthmus, at a cost of some four millions, of dollars, and then the work was abandoned for want of means to complete it.

These projects for ship communication between the Gulf of St. Lawrence and the Bay of Fundy have passed out of sight largely because of the railway lines now connecting the ports on the Gulf and the Bay. But the abandonment of these important projects adds to the claim which the three Provinces have upon the Dominion for all rail connection by means of the Tunnel. And this claim is further buttressed by the terms of union with Prince Edward Island which guarantee constant and efficient communication by steam across the Straits.

It is now more than twenty years since the Tunnel project was put forward by the late Governor Howland. It is sixteen years since Sir John Macdonald wrote him as follows:

"I fully appreciate the nature and extent of the obligation incurred by the Dominion to maintain continuous communication between the Island and mainland. We have tried to carry this out by the Stanley, but of course, she cannot fight against the elements. So if the cost comes within a reasonable amount such as Parliament feels justified in incurring, I shall be prepared to submit the question for their favorable consideration."

Sir John wrote that letter on February 6, 1891. He died in June following. In the same year, on the eve of the election

of March 1891, Hon. Wilfrid Laurier wrote his famous letter to The Guardian affirming that the Tunnel must be built if found to be reasonably practicable. We believe that had Sir John Macdonald lived we would not now be waiting for the Tunnel. It would be in operation. We still hope that Sir Wilfrid Laurier will take steps without further long delay to fulfil the hopes which both he and the great Conservative Chieftain raised so high in 1891. At least our people are determined as never before, to insist upon this being done.

### FOR PURE ELECTIONS.

If half that is said by the public men and the press of both political parties concerning the Dominion election of 1904 is true, that election was so scandalously corrupt as to constitute a national disgrace. And yet practically speaking, no one was punished. A few election petitions were lodged, some of which were dismissed on technical grounds, many were corruptly "sawed off" and a few are still pending in the courts after three years delay. These are regrettable and alarming conditions.

Church conferences, associations and synods throughout the land have taken note of the widespread electoral corruption and the grafting in public affairs. Prominent public men of both parties have hurled damaging charges against each other. And now, almost on the eve of another election we have the leader of the Opposition, Mr. Borden, called for a royal commission to investigate the general election of 1904. What is the country coming to.

There is one hopeful indication in the by-election recently held in London, Ontario, The Toronto World, whose proprietor, W. F. McLean, M. P., took an active part in the contest on behalf of the defeated Labor candidate, assures us that the

election in London was purely and honestly conducted. The World tells that the Labor candidate had no money to spend, and the opposite party was so closely watched that they feared to spend any money for corrupt purposes. The result seemed to offer a partial solution of the problem for the future.

It is most earnestly to be hoped that in the coming election opposing candidates may be brought to agree to conduct their campaigns purely and honestly. If only one party will take this ground, let the other party be watched, and if found breaking the law let the penalties be enforced. If both candidates refuse to agree to run a pure election, then there should be an independent committee appointed by the people to watch and punish both sides. Things have long been going on from bad to worse in elections. It is high time that a resolute, determined and organized effort be made to check this rampant evil of our nation in elections.

Attention is called to the importance of having the approaches to Hillsboro Bridge lighted. It is urgent that this should be attended to at once. The long dark nights are upon us and from this time on till the ice becomes passable for teams everything should be done to prevent accidents on the bridge or at its approaches. Both the Provincial Government and the City are obliged to see that lights are provided.

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### WOMEN TEACHERS' RIGHTS.

Sir,—I should like to call the attention of the public to the injustice of the treatment accorded the female teachers of this Province in the matter of salaries. In the education of the children of the Island, female teachers have for some time taken a leading part. Even as school principals they are declared by the educational authorities to be in every way equal to men; while in common school districts they are generally given the preference.

In the face of these facts, however, the law still holds that women receive a much smaller salary than men of the same class. The custom is not only unjust but also insulting to the women teachers, as it implies either inferiority or inefficiency on their part. It has, moreover, no defence worthy the name. The arguments occasionally advanced in support of it are such as would be lugged at as perille if used against the claims of a body of men. The great body of the people indeed condemn the system, while educational experts are altogether opposed to it.

Why then will no man of influence move in the matter? Cannot the men of this country be depended upon to do justice? Or must we have a "Woman's Rights" agitation?
