PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE

Bills In Committee At Yesterday Morning's Session.

Provincial Legislation, March 22. The House met at 11.15 A. M. Hon. Mr. Stewart tabled an answer to the following question of Mr. T. A. Campbell.

1. How much insurance was in force on Falconwood Hospital at the time the present Government came into power?
2. How much insurance has been received by the Government for the fire loss of the said property?
3. What claims have been presented by the Government for the said loss?

Answer:
(1) \$100,260.
(2) \$2,000.
(3) Aetna, \$12,000; Globe and Rutgers, \$14,500; Law, Union and Rook, \$12,500; London Assurance Co., \$3,000; Assurance of North America, \$5,000; Western, \$10,500; Palatine, \$7,500; Norwich, \$10,500; Union Marine, \$6,000; British General, \$3,000; Guild Hall, \$2,000; Prudential, \$4,000; Charlottetown Fire Insurance Co. \$2,000; North-ern, \$5,000.

Insurance in dispute: London Assurance Co. \$3,000; Norwich, \$3,000; General, \$4,000.

Hon. Mr. Stewart stated that answers to other questions asked would be tabled when prepared.

Mr. Strong presented a petition of the Mayor and Town Council of Summerside for an Act to further amend the Summerside Incorporation Act, 1922. The amendment is to empower the Town Council to issue \$25,000 debentures for the purpose of constructing an addition to the Summerside High School, and \$30,000 debentures for permanent streets. A bill in accordance with the petition was received and read.

On motion of Hon. Dr. MacMillan the House resumed committee reading, with Mr. Strong in the chair, of an Act respecting the registration of births, deaths, and marriages.

The bill provides machinery for the prompt collection, publication and distribution by the Registrar General of the vital statistics of the Province. It was agreed to with minor amendments.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Stewart the House went into committee, with Mr. Hunter in the chair on The Fish and Canned Fish and Canner's Inspection Act.

Hon. Mr. Stewart explained that the bill had come from the Federal Department of Fisheries. The purpose is to confer on the Dominion Government authority to enforce the regulations of the Provincial Statutes with respect to fish and canneries inspection.

It was agreed to with amendments.

At 1 p. m. the House took recess, to meet at 3 p. m. when the Budget debate was resumed.

Writs Served On Nfld. Prime Minister

ST. JOHN'S Nfld., March 22.—(By the Canadian Press) — Prime Minister Sir Richard Squires and Hon. Dr. Alexander Campbell, Minister without portfolio, today were served with writs charging that while they were members of the Newfoundland Legislative Assembly they received remuneration from the Dominion Treasury apart from ministerial salaries and sessional indemnities.

L. E. Emerson, an Opposition member in the Legislature, acting as a private citizen, brought both actions, which came as sequels to charges made on the floors of the House last month by Hon. Peter Cashin, former Minister of Finance and Customs.

The writ against the Prime Minister, who also is Minister of Justice, is for \$10,000, on the grounds that while a member of the Assembly he had received \$5,000 for services as reparations commissioner.

The writ against Dr. Campbell is for \$7,000, on the grounds that while a member of the Assembly he received \$45 per month as port doctor and \$5 per day as Immigration officer.

Speaking in the Legislature on March 15, Hon. Peter Cashin declared the Prime Minister had been paid \$5,000 out of the Reparations Fund, deposited in the Government Savings Bank by a "manipulated minute of Council."

Prominent Lawyer Passes

MONTREAL, Que., March 22.—(By the Canadian Press) — Charles Emil Monty, K. C., brother of the late Hon. Rodolphe Monty, K. C., died here yesterday, aged 49. Mr. Monty was a bachelor, and the body was taken to the home of Hon. Alfred Dugas, Minister of Marine in the Dominion. Mrs. Durand is a sister of the late Mr. Monty.

Fish And Game Executive Meeting

A well attended meeting of the executive of the Fish and Game Protective Association was held Monday evening, the President, Mr. Gilbert Gaudet in the chair.

The main feature of the meeting was the revision of the by-laws which had not been done since 1905. A committee was appointed to do this work and a number will be printed for distribution.

A number of changes was suggested with regard to sportsmen coming from abroad for the sole purpose of fishing and shooting. The clubs recommended the gun license be raised to \$20.00 and for fishing \$5.00. These fees are not half as high as in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

The matter of poaching was then dealt with. The poachers have to be strictly attended to and the fines in these cases are recommended to be raised to the limit.

A number of streams are reported already as being fished. The police reported that they had found holes cut in ice, but no c yet caught, and when they do, the offenders will get the limit.

This season any parties caught with a net around a stream will receive the full penalty, even though they claim the net is not their own.

It is said that there will be three mounted men here April first to assist in our protective service. It was also pointed out that these men are strictly non-partisan, and know no politics, and that their service would greatly strengthen our Provincial Police. The Mounties have now their headquarters in Moncton, N. B., within a call for extra service at any time.

A number of amendments to the Partridge season will be suggested to the legislature, a committee being appointed to draw-up the same. With the new increased membership and better support by the police, good work will surely follow.

Mr. Morrison stated that all owners of ponds and streams would gladly co-operate with the Fish and Game Association.

It was also brought up that more respect be paid to the owners of ponds and streams, as these people were only human, and that everybody should get permission before going on anybody's premises, and to see that no damage was done to fences and properties.

Sir Horace Wilson On Economic Committee

LONDON, March 22.—(Canadian Press) — Sir Horace Wilson chief industrial adviser to the Board of Trade since 1930, today was appointed to represent the United Kingdom on the Imperial Economic Committee in succession to Sir Sydney Chapman, chairman since 1931, who resigned. The Imperial Economic Committee was established in 1925 following proposals made at the Imperial Economic Conference of 1923. Its designated functions were to consider possibilities of improving methods of preparing for market and marketing within the United Kingdom products of the overseas parts of the Empire with a view to increasing the consumption of such products within the United Kingdom in preference to product from foreign countries. In 1927 its functions were widened to enable it to conduct at the request of the Governments of the British Commonwealth certain investigations aimed at increase in intra-Empire trade.
