JAPANESE FIND TOUGHER GOING IN CHINA WARS

Problem Of Policing Defiant Millions In Captured Areas Grows.

(By DEWITT MACKENZIE,
Associated Press Staff Writer)

NEW YORK, April 24—(AP)—
The Sino-Japanese conflict has de-
veloped into astonishing resistance
on the part of the defending Chi-
nese that many observers are won-
dering whether Japan will in the
long run be able to play Hercules
to China's Antaeus.

In case wars and recessions have
driven school-days out of readers'
memories, Antaeus was a Libyan
wrestler, the son of Poseidon and
Gaia, the earth. No one could defeat
him, because every time he touched
his mother earth he grew stronger.
Hercules finally turned the trick,
however, by lifting Antaeus up so
that he couldn't touch mother
earth.

It is almost literally true that
every time Japan has given John
Chinaman a trouncing and laid
him out, the latter has hopped up
stronger than before. It really isn't
so strange when one views all the
circumstances.

Quite apart from the remarkable
new energy being displayed by the
Chinese fighting forces, we get this
situation in the reference to the
more territory the Japanese
over-run, and the bigger the Chi-
nese population they have to keep
in hand, the greater the difficulties
of the invaders. The Japanese lines
of communication become attenu-
ated, their armies have to be spread
over a larger area, more and more
troops are needed from home and
supplies become a real problem.

The difficulty is that while the
Japanese have been "over-running"
territory, they haven't been "con-
quering" all of it. The Japanese
thus far have bitten off territory
which houses more than 20,000,
000 people. A mere refusal on the
part of the Chinese to co-operate,
not to mention active resistance,
creates a grave and far-reaching
problem for the invaders.

The real sensation, however, is
the increasing strength and activity
of the Chinese armies, under the
leadership of General Chiang Kai-
shek. Everywhere along the line of
advance the Japanese advance
discouraged both rough and ready
guerrilla warfare and attackers em-
ploying European military tactics.

Latest reports state the Chinese
have brought the Japanese advance
to a halt on the central front of
Shantung. The Japanese are rush-
ing reinforcements to this area and
a major conflict is in prospect. If
the Japanese win here, and history
shows they will, the Chinese will
simply withdraw and be ready to
fight another day.

To revert to the story of Antaeus,
the Japanese have a figure out a
way of lifting 450,000,000 Chinese
of their feet and holding them
there.

FACTS ABOUT FUR SEALS

Figures of the estimated popu-
lation and kill of fur seals through-
out this period would be useless. How-
ever, although most of the years
between 1780 to 1867 were marked
by pitiful waste, a great number
were left at the time of American
occupation. In 1877, the privilege
of taking the skins was leased to
the Alaska Commercial Company
for 20 years, and in 1890 to another
company for a similar period. Long
before the killing of the breed-
ing females had been abandoned
and it was recognized that only a
small percentage of the males were
left for the perpetuation of
the species.

was the killing of female seals that,
in addition to being pregnant, had
young pups on shore that must
starve. Various steps were taken to
discourage or abolish this destruc-
tive method, a result of exhaus-
tive studies made by a number of
the most eminent naturalists of the
United States, Canada and Great
Britain. No adequate relief result-
ed until 1911, when a treaty was
concluded between the United
States, Great Britain, Russia and
Japan that abolished sealing on the
high seas for 15 years.

In 1912 all killing of seals, ex-
cept for food for the natives, was
suspended for five years. My own
experience on the Pribilofs is lim-
ited to the summer of 1914, when
in company with Wilfred H. Os-
good of the Field Museum, and
George H. Parker of Harvard Uni-
versity, I served as a member of a
party sent to the islands to investi-
gate the current status of the herds,
with special reference to the effect
of the law of 1912. The killing of a
