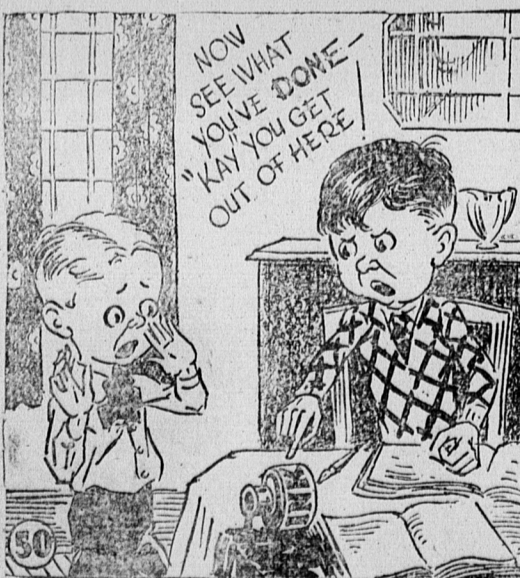

Marketing Your Silver Fox Pelts

EARLY SALES

Last year prices on Silver Fox pelts dropped fully 20% after the first AUCTION SALES. FOX MARKING

Every Fox Rancher must recognize the importance of properly kept records and identification of breeding stock. In a large ranch this is imperative, and even the rancher with only a few pairs should be able to identify his property if strayed or stolen. We are prepared to mark foxes anywhere on P. E. Island using the same methods as the Canadian National, and those with a registered mark can continue to use it. Ranchers unwilling to have an outsider in their ranch may arrange to mark their own animals, and will be supplied with a properly disinfected marking outfit and instructed in its use.

As it is only necessary to mark the animals you are keeping, the cost 50c per fox is very moderate. Apply at once to
