MARKET LETTER AS SUPPLIED BY MOWAT AND MACGILLIVRAY, STOCK BROKERS

1930 Outlook for Three Leaders on the Montreal Board most promising. No one will deny the fact that International Nickel, Brazilian Traction and Montreal Power are by far the outstanding leaders on the Montreal Stock Exchange and the action of these securities during the present year will have more influence on shaping the trend of the market as a whole, than any other single or group of stocks.

International Nickel has, during the past year or so, been considered a security with exceptionally bright possibilities. Those who purchased into the stock did so on the understanding that it would require a few years for the company to come into its full earning power. For the year just closed, International Nickel is expected to show earnings of about \$1.65 per share, but it must be remembered that the benefit from the development of the Frood Mine and the earnings over the next couple of years should show a steady expansion. Estimates for this year are about \$3 a share and for 1931 about \$5. Those who have visited the property and those who have made study of the world nickel and copper situation are convinced that International Nickel Company has all the earmarks of becoming the world's richest single mine. In the case of Brazilian Traction, the stock has suffered from economic conditions prevailing in Brazil which are unfavorable. As every one knows, this is due mainly to the overproduction of coffee, but in time, no doubt, this situation will rectify itself. The unfavorable situation in coffee has effected the milreis. Whilst a decline in the milreis would certainly affect the Company's earnings to some extent, it would not be as serious as some of the "bears" on the stock would have us believe. Shareholders of Brazilian Traction should bear in mind that the Company has been able to show an increase in earnings from month to month for over two years and there are no signs on the horizon to indicate that this trend will not continue through 1930, though increases may not be as pronounced as last year.

London has always been known as a shrewd judge of security values and the fact that the demand for Brazilian from that quarter has been persistent of late, leads one to believe that the opportunities on the long side of the security outweigh the unfavorable possibilities. Local sponsors of the stock are as bullish as ever, and in the opinion of shrewd observers, those maintaining their faith in the future of this outstanding public utility, will find themselves well rewarded in time.

Montreal Power has always been considered as one of the premier investment securities on the continent. Shareholders of "Power" have fared extraordinarily well in the past and its future is even more promising. Montreal Power is linked up directly with the progress of Montreal and as the population of this city increases, new sources of revenue are opened up to the Company. The growth in the earnings of Montreal Power since its inception has been steadily upward, and as predictions are that the City of Montreal will have a population of about 200,000,000 within the next ten years, there is every reason to believe that the company will continue on the high tide of prosperity. There are three or four pending developments for this company which should be consummated in 1930 and which should greatly enhance the value of the security. The chief of these is a split-up, which was, no doubt, delayed by the unfavorable market conditions which prevailed in the last quarter of 1929. That "Power" should always be bought and never sold, is as true today as it ever was in the past.

MONTREAL, Que., Jan. 6—Cattle receipts on the two Montreal live stock markets today totalled 1,107. With a heavier run of cattle, prices were steady to strong. Good butcher steers were a bit uneven selling from \$9 to \$9.75 with odd steers up to \$10. Common and medium quality steers brought between \$8 and \$9 and light, thin steers were down to \$6.50. Good heifers sold from \$9 to \$9.50 and just medium heifers around \$8. Ten baby calves averaging 650 pounds brought \$10.25. Butcher cows were from \$5 to \$7.75, a few of the best bringing \$8 or better.
