Case Against Jehovah's Witness Is Dismissed

The case against Alexander Csere, a Jehovah's Witness, was dismissed in the Summerside Police Court by Magistrate E. H. Strong, K.C., on Saturday morning. He was charged with being an agent of the Watch Tower and Tract Society, Inc., of Brooklyn, N. Y., and of doing business on their behalf in the Town without first obtaining a license. His wife, Elma Csere, is facing a similar charge and her case was adjourned till next Friday when the prosecution will indicate if it intends to proceed.

In dismissing the charge the Magistrate said that the evidence was not sufficient to convict and that he must give the accused the benefit of the doubt. He said further that he believed that the accused is, in fact, an agent of the Society as charged and that the literature distributed could not be considered as religious tracts and exempt from the Town by-laws. However, the evidence that a sale took place was not sufficient to convict. There was further argument by counsel when the hearing opened and then judgment was delivered.

Mr. E. E. Arnett represented the prosecution and Mr. W. E. Darby, K.C., the accused.
