NEW DANCE HAS MADE ITS FIRST APPEARANCE

DAYTON, O., June 27.—A new dance is upon us. It's the "Half-and-Half," a sort of hybridized waltz, with a little tang of the hesitation. It went like wildfire at the convention of dancing masters here, and within the next month is destined to edge out the other popular steps.

Its main point is the waltz movement at the unusual tempo of 54. There is the waltz effect—one, two, three—but the next two beats—four and five—call for a "hold" movement, a sort of hesitation.

It is a simple, attractive dance, and the hold allows of all sorts of effects. The man can utilize the "hold" to swing about to his partner's side; he can urge her off at right angles to the last step; he can "zig-zag" with a turn at each hesitation; he can reverse from a forward to a retreat movement, or her can waltz forward or backward straight down the line.

LABORITES AND THE GOVERNMENT

LONDON, June 27.—Last night's debate in the House of Commons followed its forecasted course. The efforts to induce the Laborites to vote with the Government failed at the last moment after a heated party caucus. The reduction of the Government's majority to 38 on the division was due to the abstention of 35 Laborites, and the voting against the Government of seven of the eight O'Brienites, and one Liberal.

Sixty-eight Nationalists supported the Government, illness alone accounting for their six absentees. The division was the most critical of the session for the Government, and represents the maximum effort of the opposition.

The feature of the debate was Mr. Asquith's strong defence of Mr. Lloyd George's financial policy, with which he emphatically identified the entire Cabinet. Incidentally, he eloquently repudiated the charge that the Liberal financing was extravagant, quoting figures to show that although the expenditure since 1906 had increased by £20,000,000 to old age pensions, national insurance and other social reforms, and £2,000,000 for education.

His vindication was so powerful that the Labor leader had difficulty in compelling his men to adhere to the caucus decision to abstain from voting.

According to the best lobby opinion, the position of the Government has actually been strengthened.

ANOTHER VIEW OF THE VOTE.

LONDON, June 27.—The Government's reduced majority in the division on the Finance Bill was due not alone to the abstention of the Labor party from voting. Seven independent Nationalists, and one Liberal, Sir Luke White, voted against the Government, while Mr. Joseph Martin abstained from voting. There were numerous pairs, due to general slackness now being felt in Parliamentary circles.

The Liberals expressed some indignation over the Laborites' action, declaring that the latter party is playing the Tory game. The Laborites reply by reminding the Liberals of the North-East Derbyshire election, when the Liberals attacked and won a Labor seat. The Labor resentment over this fight and particularly Mr. Lloyd George's commendation of the Liberal candidate is still unappeased. They also regard the Government's penny reduction from the maximum rate of the income tax as a victory for the rich.

ANTI-WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE LEAGUE.

LONDON, June 27.—The effect of militancy upon public sentiment may be seen in the fact that over 58,000 adherents were reported at yesterday's meeting of the National Anti-Suffrage League. Earl Curzon, of Kedleston, who presided, claimed that the anti-suffrage cause stood in a stronger position today than it did for the past twenty years. If the temper of the militants continued, he said, he was sure public opinion would demand that the convicted women pay the full penalty for their crimes.
