NEW YORK, March 15—The news from Europe this morning seems to be a little better, leading Locarno delegates says a compromise among the Locarno Powers is being worked out. According to Dow Jones the latest quotations by Lloyds against a European war are 9 1/2 to 1 and against French troops entering the Rhineland

within 3 months 48 1/2 to 1. Two days ago Lloyds would not make quotations concerning a European war. A London despatch says that the League had invited Germany to participate in Monday's session. In view of the slight improvement in foreign news and the fact that the market held comparatively well in the last hour yesterday, we believe there is a good chance of the market rallying this morning.

TORONTO, March 15—Easing of the war scare tension brought quick relief to the mining share section of Toronto exchange Saturday, prices advancing sharply, following three days of declines. The gold share index registered a gain of 5.03 to 121.00 and the miscellaneous mines index moved up 3.75 to 133.15. Gold and base metal shares ran about an even race in the recovery.
 Dome advanced 1-2 and Lake Shore and McIntyre added 1-2 to 5-8 each, while Bralorne and Wright Hargreaves were up 25 to 35 cents each.
 In the base metals Noranda and Hudson Bay had fractional gains and Falconbridge and Sudbury Basin moved up 50 cents each.

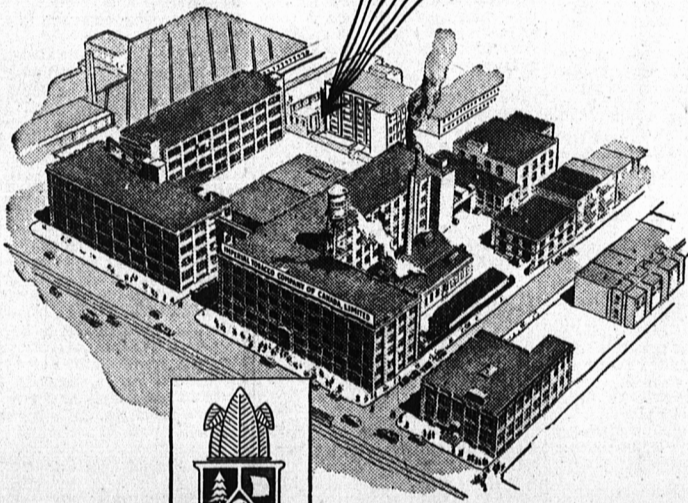

Recovery Sets In As War Fears Disperse

NEW YORK, March 15—Will- ingness of European powers to arbitrate German rearmament on a peaceful basis provided the impetus Saturday for the greatest one-day recovery in the stock market since Jan. 15, 1934, when President Roosevelt sought authority to devalue the dollar.
 The two-hour session opened with advances of fractions to around a point, and the upward momentum gained steadily until the final gong confirmed gains of 1 to more than 8 points on the day. Participating most fully in the betterment were industrials, oils, chemicals, aircrafts, utilities, rails and steels.
 Allied Chemical boomed 8 3-4 to 186 3-4, and Amradra gained 8 points to 120.
 One of the most heavily traded issues was Electric Power & Light which ended 2 points higher at 15 3-4. Two other popular issues were Curtiss-Wright, up 1-4 at 8 1-2, and Standard Oil of N. J., up 1 3-8 at 65 1-4.
 Other outstanding gainers included American Smelting & Refining, up 3 3-4 at 82 3-4; American Telephone, up 3 at 168 1-4; Union Pacific, 3 1-4 at 132; U. S. Steel, up 2 1-2 at 63 1-4; Transcontinental & Western, up 3 3-8 at 20 1-4; U. S. Rubber, up 5 1-2 at 71 3-4; and Bethlehem Steel, up 3 1-8 at 55 5-8.
 The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced 1.7 points to 61.5, the rise being the best since Jan. 15, 1934. Transactions totalled 1,425,580 shares, slightly under the previous Saturday.
