SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE

PARIS, Oct. 27. - The cabinet has reached a decision regarding the application of the law providing for the separation of church and state, by which the property for revenues of the churches in the event of the clergy persisting in their present rebellious attitude, will be sequestered December 31, but the churches themselves will remain open for public worship, under the laws of assembly of 1801, during the ensuing year before the law goes finally into effect.
