A RUSSO GERMAN TREATY.

In spite of the vehement denials of the Berlin press that a secret treaty, or understanding, exists between the governments of Russia and Germany, there are good reasons for such an understanding given by those who persist in declaring it a fact. In the first place, it is pointed out by the Montreal Witness, Russia needs the benevolent neutrality of Germany in the present crisis in the Far East, and may want her friendship still

more later on. In the second place, Germany is deeply concerned in weakening the alliance between Russia and France which holds her in a vice and acts as a constant damper on her "welt politik." On all possible occasions the Emperor William has shown a desire for closer relations with Russia. Not long ago he went so far as to offend popular German sentiment by ordering the prosecution of Russian students in German universities for giving offence to the Russian government. The prosecution failed, and the applause with which the failure was greeted by the unofficial German press showed that the Emperor's pro-Russian sentiments were not shared by his people. Popular feeling does not, however, much affect the Emperor's foreign policy. That he regards as his own special and exclusive field and, though he has not won any noteworthy success in it, he may contemplate an opportunity for strengthening his position hereafter. His attitude is sustained by the growing cordiality between Great Britain and France and the sore need Russia is in for a friend to stand by her in the great crisis, which must soon come, should Japan continue victorious in Manchuria and the fall of Port Arthur destroy Russia prestige in China.

A WORLD GATHERING.

Toronto News: The "in" way of expressing discontent is more than ever "W-o-l-f!" You may cry "W-o-l-f!" when there is no wolf there at all; or you may cry it when there is only a cub, and a small one at that. Or you may cry "Lion!" when the most impressive animal any where round is a tom-cat. When the news of the battle of Trafalgar reached London, The Times published it with no display of type whatever. But the modern world has changed all that, and very minor events are now heralded with a display of type and an affluence of adjectives guaranteed to arrest the most thoughtless reader. The result is, that if a thing of real importance, which does not readily lend itself to typographical display, or megaphone announcement, is not brought before the public in the manner they are accustomed to, but in sober and modest guise, it is apt to be overlooked altogether. The New York Independent says that this precise thing has happened to a most important matter, the assembling at St. Louis on the 19th of this month of the International Congress of Arts and Sciences. "The American 'people,'" says that journal, "are so deaf to anything but loud talking, that nothing less than red and yellow circus posters proclaiming it as the most stupendous aggregation of living talent brought under one canvas in this country would be needed to bring the general public to a realization of their opportunities." The Congress will indeed take high rank among world gatherings. In addition to a vast array of American talent not less than 400 foreign scholars of eminence had been invited to take part in it; an every great branch of science, and all studies that make for social culture, were discussed by men who rank among the masters of those who know.

U. S. VIEWS ON RECIPROCITY.

Dealing with reciprocity from a railway standpoint, The Railway World of Philadelphia says:—"Aside from the personality of the candidates, the leading issue in the Presidential campaign is rapidly centering around tariff revision. The sentiment for reciprocity within the Republican ranks has developed surprising strength, especially in Massachusetts, where it may have unexpected consequences. In the west the farmers are still predominantly Republican in sentiment, but a large number of them are fully convinced of the injustice of some of the prices which they have to pay and are certain to impress these convictions upon their representatives. Even in the middle States, the ancient stronghold of protection, a sentiment favoring more liberal trade relations is already discernible. No matter which party successful in the November election, tariff revision is probable in the near future."

By the unseating of Hon. E. J. Davis, Commissioner of Crown Lands local member for North York, Ontario the parties in the Ontario Legislature without the Speaker are evenly divided. An election in the new future is a probability.

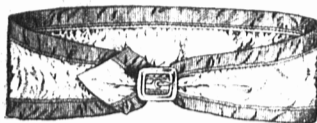

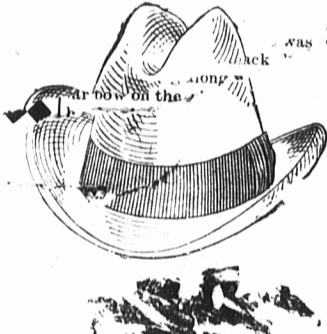
