**JERE MCAULIFFE DEAD** - A half century of stage work ended by death, Jere McAuliffe, veteran actor of London, Ont., will be buried here, says a New York exchange of Dec. 12th. McAuliffe died Sunday, aged 74 years. His most recent engagements were with "Sally, Irene and Mary," "My Maryland" and "Honeymoon Lane." Burial will be in the plot reserved for stage and screen folk in Kensico cemetery following Mass in the actors' chapel of St. Malachy's church. In the boom days when Charlottetown was one of the best theatre towns in the Maritimes, Jere McAuliffe was an annual visitor and played many engagements, and is very kindly remembered in P. E. Island.

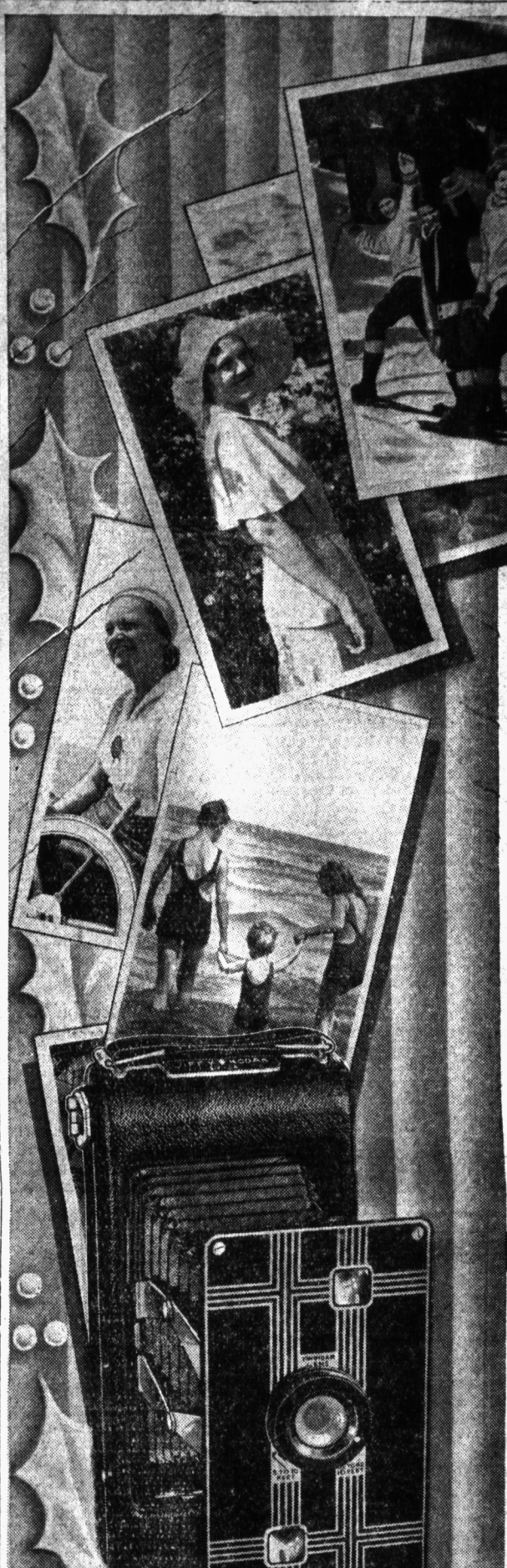

### Questioning Cost Of Parcel Post

OTTAWA, Dec. 14 - (C. P.): The trans-Atlantic rate structure in the matter of parcel post is an extremely complex one, post office officials said here tonight, commenting on complaints of Mr. Henry W. Morgan, president of the Montreal Board of Trade. Mr. Morgan is lodging a protest with Hon. Arthur Sauve against charges on parcel post to the United Kingdom being higher than to countries in continental Europe. These rates rest entirely upon individual agreements with the countries concerned, it was said.

### Quebec Soil Seed

The following is a list of seed mixtures recommended by the Quebec Seed Board for the Province of Quebec: - Mixture "A" - Well drained, non acid soils. Per 100 lbs.: timothy 40 lbs.; red clover 30 lbs.; alsike clover 15 lbs.; alfalfa 15 lbs. Rate of seeding per acre, 13 to 16 lbs. Mixture "B" - Heavy clay, poorly drained. Per 100 lbs.: timothy 40 lbs.; alsike clover 40 lbs.; red clover 20 lbs. Rate of seeding per acre, 13 to 16 lbs. Mixture "C" - Light soil. Per 100 lbs.: red clover 20 lbs.; alsike 10 lbs.; timothy 40 lbs.; Kentucky blue 10 lbs.; red top 5 lbs. Rate of seeding per acre, 14 to 16 lbs. Mixture for Pasture - Per 100 lbs.: alfalfa 5 lbs.; red clover 10 lbs.; alsike 10 lbs.; white clover 5 lbs.; timothy 40 lbs.; Kentucky blue 10 lbs.; red top 5 lbs. Rate of seeding per acre, 15 to 20 lbs.

### Red Carrots As Winter Feed For Poultry

(Experimental Farms' Note) It is a known fact that green feed in one form or another is a very valuable addition to a poultry ration. No matter how well balanced any ration may be there seems to come a time when a change is desirable. Variety in a diet is possibly no less welcome to the hen than to the human race. Though it has been authentically reported that birds receiving dried green feed such as alfalfa leaf meal may give results as good if not better than birds receiving steeped alfalfa, cabbage and mangels, the question is whether in diet is a point that will always deserve consideration. In the feeding of the birds in the Egg-Laying Contests at the Dominion Experimental Farm, Agassiz, B.C., particular attention has been given to the matter of green feed. For many years mangels were used in this connection with good results. However, as evidently the value of the mangels did not justify its classification so much as a green feed as a succulent feed, the attention of those responsible has recently been turned more and more to the value of red carrots. The latter is of value not only for its succulency but for its vitamin content also. No matter how well balanced a ration may be success in feeding whether it be poultry or other live stock depends very much indeed on the ability of the feeder. It is here where his power of observation comes in. Birds will apparently, if given the opportunity, pick out from a number of feeds not only what they prefer but what is best for them. Although no definite experiment has been carried out at Agassiz in the feeding of red carrots as against mangels, the evidence so far ob-

### Favor Building Suspension Bridge

VANCOUVER, Dec. 14 - (C. P.): Civic electors by a large majority today approved plans for the building by British interests of a \$6,000,000 suspension bridge across the entrance to Vancouver harbor at first narrows.

MONTREAL, Dec. 14 - (C. P.): It is cheaper to mail a parcel to Denmark than to the United Kingdom, the Montreal Board of Trade has found.

The Board today decided to ask the Postmaster General to explain this fact. The rate, the Board stated, on a seven-pound parcel to Denmark is 84 cents while the rate on a parcel of the same size to Great Britain is \$1.32. Not only Denmark is reached by a lower parcel post rate than the United Kingdom. The Board found, it was announced, that 10 pounds are carried to Czechoslovakia via France and Germany for \$1.50 whereas via England and Germany the rate is \$1.70. Ten pounds to Denmark cost 99 cents.

But the Canadian sending a ten pound parcel to the United Kingdom pays \$1.32, the Board stated.
