SALE OF SEIZED LIQUORS.

The law now in force in this city with regard to liquors kept for illegal sale and found and seized under a search warrant, provides that "the Magistrate making the conviction may in and by the said conviction, or by a separate or subsequent order, declare the said liquor and vessels, or any part thereof, to be forfeited to His Majesty to be sold or destroyed, and the proceeds of such sale shall be paid into the Provincial Treasury to and for the uses of the Government." A recent seizure, and the probability that other seizures may follow, brings us face to face with this matter of the disposal of seized liquors. As we read the law it is left in the discretion of the Magistrate as to whether he shall order the liquors to be destroyed or sold.

There are we think, strong reasons why the liquors should be destroyed and not sold. Certainly we do not think they ought to be sold indiscriminately to the highest bidder. If a sale could be made with assurance that the purchasers desire the stuff for purely medicinal or mechanical purposes, no objection need be made thereto, but an ordinary public sale by auction would almost inevitably mean that it would be bought for use as a beverage. This we think would be against the sentiments of almost the entire community whether of total abstainers or the drinking portion. Any who would favor such a disposal of the seized liquors would be those who may desire to bring the prohibitory law into disrepute, which it would certainly do.

Such a sale would give occasion for many to speak strongly against the Government which, having passed a prohibitory law and having punished men for selling or keeping liquors for sale illegally would actually for gain sell the same liquors. It would be, aside from moral considerations, an extremely impolitic thing for the Government to permit itself to be placed in such a position. Our Province is not so poor that the treasury must be enriched by the few dollars to be had by selling contraband liquor. Nor can we think that the moral sentiment of the people of this Province would approve of making or saving a few dollars in that way. We trust therefore that the seized liquors may be destroyed if they cannot be disposed of for legitimate use other than for use as a beverage.
