**The Markets At A Glance**

**CHICAGO, Jan. 21 (AP)**—The ceilingless May rye futures contract suffered a sinking spell today, slipping the five cent a bushel daily trade limit. Other grains eased in sympathy, with oats off almost two cents at times despite good commercial business.

**WINNIPEG, Jan. 21 (CP)**—Rye futures prices on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today declined as much as five cents maximum permitted for one day's trading, and closed 4 7/8 cents lower with May at \$2.03 1/2. July \$1.84 asked, and Oct. \$1.73 5/8 asked.

**TORONTO, Jan. 21 (CP)**—Influenced, apparently by the spread of labor strikes, stocks sold down on the Toronto Exchange today to post their widest decline in some weeks. Base Metals took a loss of 16 in the index traded by the golds with 71. Western Oil finished 31 down. A few gold issues recovered slightly in the final few minutes.

**MONTREAL, Jan. 21 (CP)**—Security prices tumbled in transfers today on the Stock Exchange and Curb. All key groups were lower in the indices, except banks which had a modest increase. Market analysts said that lower tendencies were marked to begin with on Friday by nervousness among traders at the establishing of business on a cash and not margin basis in New York and that a technical adjustment of prices after the long recent upswing followed. Volume was not high.

**NEW YORK, Jan. 21 (AP)**—Newspaper strikes threatening the nation's economy, stocks dropped 1 to 4 points today in the sharpest market tumble for more than a month.

Volume tapered from the start due partly to the 100 per cent margin decree which became effective today. Activity was aided in the first hour by 1,000 to 15,000-share blocks. Activity spread in price, was attributed to the "freezing" of accounts by the new all-cash regulation.

Steels, Motors and "Blue Chips" led the retreat. Supporting bids arrived at the finish and extreme declines were reduced in the majority of cases.

Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 13 points in the steepest recession since Dec. 17 last.

**MONTREAL, Jan. 21 (CP)**—In the face of light receipts trading on the Livestock Markets.

In the cattle division good quality steers sold in 13-15-25. Medium and heavy grades were reduced from 8.50 up. Heifers ranged from 7-12. Cows were 9-15. Higher medium classes were 8-9 and common butchers 6.75-7.75. Canners and cutters brought 10.50.

Commoner kinds were 7-8.50. Veals made up a good percentage of offerings in calves, were 10-10.50 with a few toping 16.

Grassers in the market, higher going mostly between 9-10.50 with some selling at 9-7-10. Bulk of the hogs were 20 for Grade A. Sows were 18-22 dressed.

Local lambs were 12.50 flat. Sheep were 3.50-3.50. Two carloads of western-fed lambs failed to attract offers.
