RAILWAY SANITATION.

A railway receives and debarks at its stations and carries in its passenger cars all sorts and conditions of men, women and children, some of whom are healthful, cleanly and refined, and various other grades including the diseased, (sometimes afflicted with contagious disease) and those whose habits are uncleanly and in some cases downright filthy. The railway is a common carrier and usually, like the graveyard, takes all that come along, provided only that they have purchased tickets. Thus the same train carries the Governor and the humblest of his Indian subjects, the lady and gentleman of refined tastes and the Mongolian. By force of circumstances in passing through a train all classes and conditions are brought into close contact, and even in the first-class coach one does not know who his next neighbor may be.

Such being the conditions of railway passenger traffic it is not surprising that the American Public Health Association should have given attention to the subject of car sanitation, as it has done. A paper read before this Association by Prof. S. H. Woodbridge and reproduced in the Montreal Pharmaceutical Journal is before us and deals with this subject in a trenchant manner. After pointing out the dangers from the prevailing loose methods, Prof. Woodbridge makes a series of recommendations which are worthy of all attention. These include the strict isolation of passengers ill of any contagious disease; improved construction of cars with interiors having hard, smooth, polished surfaces; the furnishings should be non-absorbent and easily removable for cleaning; car-cleaning to be frequent and thorough and the cleaning of all removable articles to be done outside the car, interior dusting to be done with a damp cloth instead of the feather duster; ventilation to be such as to give each passenger 1,000 cubic feet of fresh, warm air per hour without draughts; an even temperature instead of alternate overheating and chill; the frequent use of disinfectants and sterilising treatment for floors, sanitary and lavatory fixtures; the water and ice supply to be of the purest; (ice should no more be handled by bare hands or by dirty gloves than drinking water should be poured over such hands or gloves into the water holder); the water tank to be cleaned periodically and sterilised with boiling

...to be educated to carry their own... instead of using the car cup;... to be protected against fouling, and persons who expectorate on the floor to be severely punished, after prohibitory notices have been posted in the cars; station premises to receive attention directed to general cleanliness of floors, furnishing, air, sanitaries, lavatories, platforms and approaches, and to be plentifully supplied with disinfecting material, pure water and safe means of drinking it.

We believe these recommendations will commend them to intelligent and thoughtful travellers. Advance cannot be made by a single jump to all that is requisite, but the public have a right to expect at least a gradual progress in that direction, and just in proportion as the ideal conditions are attained so far will the public health, security, comfort and convenience be promoted. A well-known medical practitioner has directed our attention to the subject, and we feel that it is a timely and important one, well worthy of being brought before the public and the railway authorities throughout the Dominion. Our own railway and the Government railways in general are fairly abreast of the standard set by other roads in sanitary matters, but we know of no railway in the country which would not be the better for the adoption of the recommendations a part of which are outlined above.

The land grant asked by the Trans-Canada Railway (Mackenzie & Mann) of the Quebec Government, is a modest 20,000 acres per mile for the 390 mile section which lies in that Province. This would be over seven million acres, and a big Anglo-American syndicate had already offered a dollar and a half an acre for twenty-five million acres of Quebec's waste lands. So says the Montreal Witness. At this rate the value of the land subsidy asked would be equal to \$30,000 per mile, while it is contended that the road can be built through the Quebec section for \$20,000 per mile. What will be asked in the way of subsidy for the 2,000 odd miles west of Quebec Province can only be guessed at present. And then here is the Grand Trunk to be also provided for!

Premier Tweedie of New Brunswick in a recent interview said the Premiers of the three Maritime Provinces will strenuously oppose any reduction of the representation of their Provinces in the House of Commons; that the understanding at Confederation was that representation might be increased but not diminished, and he added: "I have discussed the subject with Premier Murray and Premier Peters and we feel confident that no attempt will be made to put in force the clause of the B. N. A. Act which provides for a reduction in certain cases. It may not be necessary to change the Act, for such would certainly be a big undertaking, but it may be agreed to allow the Eastern Provinces to retain their present representation, even though it should be decided to increase the number of members in the Provinces that have increased their population."

President Castro is described as of a decidedly Indian type, short, with a very black beard, and slightly lame from a wound he received at the battle of Teoyitio, which made him President. Though lame, he is fond of dancing, in which he excels. He lives in an imposing residence at Caracacas which it took six years to build and furnish, and which cost a million dollars. His personal vanity and disposition to braggadocio are very well illustrated in a proclamation issued "to the army under my command," after the combats with revolutionary forces from October 11 to 18 last: "In the consecutive engagements of these days," he says, (we quote the official translation), "you have witnessed the celebrated concept of being inviolable. These engagements have been so many pages of august consecration to the deferent appreciation of your contemporaries and to the honor of apotheosis in the infinite field of history."

SUNNYSIDE.

The conviction against P. Doherty for a third offence against the Provincial Prohibition Act is to be brought before the Supreme Court by a writ of certiorari issued by Mr. Justice Hodgson. Pending the decision of the full Bench proceedings are stayed and the defendant is reported to have returned to town.

Attorney General Pugsley has given out that he expects New Brunswick will shortly receive an addition of \$100,000 to its annual subsidy from the Dominion. This would mean a probable addition of \$1,500,000 to the aggregate subsidies paid to the Provinces from the central treasury. Even with that increase the Provinces would still be relatively worse off than the federal Dominion, because of the quadrupled revenues which the Dominion now receives, as compared with the federal revenue at the time when the financial relations between the Dominion and the Provinces were first established. If New Brunswick gets \$100,000 the Island ought to get an addition of about one-third of that amount.
