A FIGHT FOR THE MACE.

We are more and more concerned for the spinster Colony of uncertain age, standing amid the chill winds and icebergs of the mid Atlantic, harassed by fogs and Frenchmen and still refusing to come within the sheltering arms of the Dominion. For tidings have come, borne upon the pages of the Daily News, of sad disorder in the Terra Nuova household. It was all about the parliamentary mace, an article which does not exist in Prince Edward Island, and to relate. This want gives to the P. E. Island Legislature a more or less emaciated appearance. But the Newfoundland Parliament like that of Great Britain, Canada and many other countries is fortunately possessed of a mace, for the better sitting forth of its power and dignity, the preservation of decorum, and also upon occasion to give spice to the proceedings, as we shall see.

Great is the mace in the matter of Parliamentary ceremonial. It is related to the sceptre of Kings, to the divining rods of ancient magicians, to the staff of Moses. For these were the material symbols of more than ordinary control over men and things and were viewed by men with a faith inspired by dread. So the mace in Parliament is significant of that control which produces order and of that power behind the throne which insists upon and is able to enforce obedience. It has a ceremonial of its own, which, as Haversham Cox has stated, "befits that ancient symbol of the authority of the Commons, which is associated with so many eventful passages in English history—which was never yet insulted with impunity but when Liberty received a wound." Borne always before the Speaker when he enters the Chamber, resting on the table while he occupies the chair, placed under the table on a cushion when the Speaker vacates the chair for the House to go into committee, reverently placed on the table when the Speaker resumes the chair, and borne before him to his chambers when he leaves the chair at the adjournment, it is an object of highest reverence. No member has ever dared to pass between Mr. Speaker and the mace on such occasions; and the fates only know what would happen if such parliamentary sacrilege should be committed.

In fact to put it briefly—no mace no Parliament; no Parliament no representative institutions and no liberty! Hence the appalling significance of that remark once made by one Oliver Cromwell when by force he gave the grand bounce to the Parliament of his time. He pointed to the mace: "Take away that bauble! Ye are no longer a Parliament." So much by way of preface to what has now brought scandal upon the thrice puissant Legislature and has harrowed the sensibilities of the people of the Ancient Colony. Here are the bald and circumstantial facts as related by The News:

The members of the Assembly were summoned to attend at 11.30 a. m., when they were to proceed to Government House and there present the address in reply to the speech from the throne to His Excellency the Governor. When the hour arrived for opening the House, the Sergeant-at-Arms was not present, and in order to secure the mace, without which the proceedings could not commence, the door of the Sergeant-at-Arms' room had to be forced open. Having waited a short time, it was decided that one of the pages should act as Sergeant and carry the mace. By some bungling the members preceded the mace, and as they were passing out the Sergeant came up the back stairs apparently intoxicated, and forcibly relieved the page of the emblem of legislative authority, afterwards returning to his room presumably to dress. Meantime the members proceeded to Government House, where, upon arrival, finding the mace had not come, they decided to send back to the Assembly for the Sergeant-at-Arms the news of whose escapade with the page had reached them. Time passed, His Excellency the Governor waited, and finally the members were ushered in minus the mace. Later the Sergeant-at-Arms arrived and staggered into the room with the mace!

On returning to the Assembly room His Honor the Speaker took cognizance of the affair. Calling the Sergeant-at-Arms up to the table, before the mace, the Speaker proceeded to administer a well-merited reprimand. Addressing the offending official, His Honor said: "Your conduct during the past three days has been disgraceful, and I have reported you. If you are again guilty of similar conduct, you will be dismissed immediately. You have kept this house waiting for over a quarter of an hour. You have kept His Excellency waiting; and your conduct has been of such character as will not be tolerated

Further." Thus as by a hair's breadth the ship of state escaped being engulfed in the maelstrom of perdition. Thus nearly perished untimely the cherished representative institutions of Newfoundland. While Governor and Ministers of State held their breath in suspense; while the Opposition shuddered with averted gaze; while the stately walls of the Parliament Building were bathed in a cold sweat; while the blind gigantic Sampson of disorder was stretching forth his hands to grasp the pillars of the governmental fabric and whelm it in ruin—in that last critical moment the situation was saved. The Sergeant staggered in with the mace; the distracted country heaved one long sigh of relief, echoed by a hundred for horns round the coast, and the east wind brought rain.

We tender our congratulations to Newfoundland over a terrible fate averted, an awful crisis now past. But lest the danger recur, lest the Sergeant should again become obfuscated and again imperil the liberties of the state; would it not be well to politically anchor Terra Nova to the stable mainland of the Dominion? The heart of Canada goes out to you in your dangers and perplexities, dear Terra. In fondest affection Canada calls, "Come rest in this bosom, my own stricken deer." For some day that terrible Sergeant may utterly fail to come to time, and then? What then? In the name of all that's federal, what then?

The impression of those who ought to be well-informed in such matters is that during nearly thirty years past there has not been so much heavy ice in the straits as during the current winter.
