what they should be. In some inspectors fifty per cent. are not even up to our low standard.

OUTHOUSES.
The outhouses in many districts are an abomination in the land. We cannot find terms strong enough to qualify the wretched state of these doorless, unsightly, and filthy buildings.

SCHOOL GROUNDS.
In the West the minimum size by law is one acre. With us one acre is certainly beyond the maximum. With the inauguration of school gardens our school grounds must necessarily, in many cases, yea, in all cases be enlarged and enclosed. Having a million acre farm shall we deny a paltry 500 acres to our children? Decidedly not!

INSPECTORS.
We need all of our ten Inspectors under present conditions we are only following the example of other provinces. The number of our schools is 471, less than 50 schools to each Inspector. There should be five visits to each school. A great measure of good can be done by our Inspectors if they realize the importance of the work in hand, their high calling, their sacred mission in the community. It is their business to communicate new zeal and enthusiasm to the teachers, to guide and direct. They should devote one whole day to the district visiting. If the inspection of the school does not require all their time, a visit to the Trustees will be productive of a world of good. Better

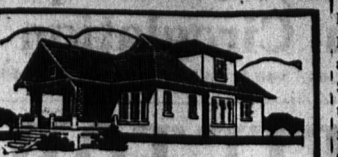

still they should invite the Trustees, through the teacher, or directly, by writing to each one, to meet them at the school on the day of the inspection. Then they can point out to them the defects in equipment, visit the outbuildings, suggest repairs, an amelioration of school property, plead with them for larger grounds for their children, and the enclosing of such grounds, preach consolidation, etc., etc.

PARENTS.
Many of our teachers deplore the lack of sympathy and co-operation on the part of the parents. These do not visit the schools or interest themselves in the studies of their children. For the most part the fault lies at the teacher's door. We would suggest a mothers' meeting once each month. The teacher might invite the mothers through the children, or better still, personally when possible. If the mothers become really interested, then the face of conditions will undergo a rapid change for the better.

TRUSTEES.
Live, earnest teachers can do much to win over the sympathy and co-operation of the Trustees. Let them persevere in their laudable efforts in this direction, and the non-observance of Section 69 of the School Act will be a thing of the past. No man should accept the high office of Trustee, and not make some effort to feel his obligations.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTES.
Noting with the utmost satisfaction what the Women's Institutes are doing for the betterment of our schools with regard to sanitation, we strongly recommend the suggestion made by Chief Superintendent Campbell and Acting Superintendent Shaw that the School Act be so amended at the next session to give every woman whose husband is a rate-payer a vote at all school meetings. It is suggested further that all such women be made eligible by law to become a Trustee.

HIGHER SALARIES FOR TEACHERS.
There were 586 teachers in the schools last year. The total amount for supplements to the people, sup-

plements by the Government, amount paid by the Government for attendance grant, and for bonuses was \$67,915.99, or an average of \$116 per teacher. A teacher of the first class receives a statutory salary from the Government of \$300; add to this \$116 and we find that the total salary of such teacher to be \$416. A first or second class male teacher, teaching in an ungraded school, will receive \$225 plus \$116, or in all \$341. The man who can neither read nor write, and can only work with a pick or shovel receives \$1.50 per day. If he works 300 days out of the year he receives \$450. If he works the same number of days as a teacher, say about 220, he receives \$330, about the same as the first class male teacher in the ungraded school. An ordinary mechanic to-day receives at least \$2.50 a day. If he works the same number of days as a teacher he will receive \$550. In many of our churches the minimum salary for the clergymen is \$1,000, three times the average teacher's salary. There is no profession or calling upon which the quality of the citizenship of the nation depends so much as the teacher. It is therefore important that the teacher, above all others, should have training and experience. In this province the teacher has neither, for the normal training is practically nil. The boy or girl matriculates into Prince of Wales College, and spends a term or two there. He has not yet made up his mind what his life calling should be, and while he is taking a breathing spell, so to speak, he becomes a school teacher. He remains a member of that profession a year or two, and

just when he is acquiring some small experience, when he is reaching the age of maturity and thought, he leaves it, and some other as young and inexperienced as he was in the beginning takes his place. Teaching which should be one of the greatest professions, is not a profession in this province, but a momentary pause on life's highway. How can it be otherwise, so long as our teachers are so much underpaid? Young men and women cannot live on the Island on the present average teacher's salary. Even if he spends a life time and reaches the very top, he is receiving less than the beginner in any other profession.

How can the salary be increased? We cannot expect very much improvement under the present system. About one-third of the revenue of the province for 1915 was spent on Education, and it cannot be expected that a much greater proportion can be spared for that purpose. It seems to be a hopeless task to induce the rate-payers at the annual school meetings to materially increase supplements. For the past few years since the revival of the supplements, efforts have been made along that line, but the results have been disappointing. Were we to abolish the system of Govern-

ment assistance, and compel each district to pay the teacher by direct district taxation, the task would be utterly beyond many of the present school districts. We have too many schools and too many districts. The only remedy in sight is through school consolidation.
