In accordance with the system adopted three years ago the Trustees are asking the people of Kings and Queens Counties for the financial assistance that is absolutely necessary for the maintenance of the Hospital.

On account of the much larger number of patients treated and the higher price of all supplies the amount required to square all accounts at the end of the year will be not less than ten thousand dollars. The collections outside Charlottetown will be made through the Trustees of the different school districts. In Charlottetown a general collection will be made by the envelope system envelopes will be left at every house on the last Friday and Saturday of October and will be taken up on the following Monday. In addition a special collection will be asked for from the business and professional men of the city and special collectors will take charge of this work. In making the collections in previous years we have found that a great many people are under the impression that the rates charged patients should be sufficient to make the Hospital self sustaining. In order to correct this wrong impression we are submitting herewith a copy of the rates charged in one of the large Montreal Hospitals for accommodation no better than our own:

REGULATIONS GOVERNING PRIVATE AND SEMI-PRIVATE PATIENTS

The charge for room No. 14 Ward H. is \$10.00 per day. This charge includes ordinary diet, medicine and dressings and the divided attention of the nurses.

Table with columns: Private, Semi-Private. Rows: Anaesthetist's Fee, Radiograph & X-Ray Treatment, Operating Room Fee, Special Nurse, per diem, Special Nurse for Mental, Alcoholic and Tuberculous cases, per diem.

A Deposit of \$30.00 is required on admission; this deposit will be credited on the FINAL adjustment of the account.

Accounts are rendered every Friday and must be paid not later than the following MONDAY morning. The final account MUST be paid in full before the patient leaves the Hospital.

It is necessary that a guarantee for the payment of the account be made in writing by some person other than the patient admitted, unless the patient is known by the officials of the Hospital.

The above rates are more than double those charged by the Prince Edward Island Hospital and this Montreal Hospital is endowed with several million dollars whereas our endowment fund is less than forty thousand. In addition the Montreal Hospital is obliged to ask for large yearly collections to enable them to carry on their work.

The Prince Edward Island Hospital has been built and equipped by several large and many small gifts from generous, public spirited people. It has been given free and unencumbered to the people of Prince Edward Island for the noble purpose of saving life and relieving suffering. No person applying for treatment is turned away if we have room. If a patient can pay they do so, if not they are received and treated just the same. This is your Hospital as Trustees are only its temporary guardians. While occupying this position it is our duty to see that it is properly equipped in every way to minister to the wants of the general public and we have only been able to do this by the continuous assistance of a generous and public spirited public and can only continue by receiving this support. Our needs are greater this year than ever before. We are counting on everyone to give us their loyal support with just a little larger contribution than usual. The collectors will start out November 1st. Kindly be ready for them, meet them with a smile and a generous contribution and so make their work pleasant and easy. We know you will do this.
