THE LIGHT THAT FAILS.

Both in Federal and Local affairs, the Liberal Party lacks the unity and unanimity necessary to a successful government. Both at Charlottetown and Summerside last week conventions have been held and a long string of delegates appointed to attend the "light in the window" convention to be held in Ottawa the first week in August.

As a matter of fact, only at or after the convention at Ottawa can the Liberal party come together and bury the hatchet, and by that time our provincial election will have been held and the remnant of Liberalism in this province put to flight.

At any rate the "light in the window" policy is the only one which obtains at present, and it suggests to those for whom it is set up an implication that the "true" Liberals still look upon them as Prodigals, who must creep back at night lest their former associates see them before they gain the shadow of home.

The only terms upon which there can be restoration of Liberal unity is by so holding the coming national convention that conscriptionist Liberals shall be as welcome as anti-conscriptionist Liberals, and at which a platform will be adopted progressive enough and courageous enough to warrant the return of the errant knights at noon-day through the front door.

BIG DIVIDENDS AND THINGS.

All Canada is seething with indignation over the extortionate profits made by certain companies, as discovered by the Parliamentary Committee now in session at Ottawa. The profits ranged from 79.2 to something over 100 per cent., and there is a suspicion that they even went higher than the figures indicated.

These profits were all exorbitant, were extortionate, were un-Christian and because of them many a poor family was obliged to wear its pre-war clothes and to replenish its stock of other necessities by making many sacrifices.

When did we discover that this was such a criminal procedure? Have we not all been in it up to the hilt for years past? Did we not within the past three or four years boast of having made from two to five hundred per cent. on certain investments, and did we not fall over each other in trying to invest our money in companies that promised the biggest dividends?

We are not justifying the enormous profits. We are not even referring to them with any hope of successfully prescribing a remedy. A temporary remedy, probably the only one possible, will be found in the pending legislation to prevent combines, stock watering and other modern, successful high financing methods, blessed or cursed as the results may fall, but the permanent cure will not have been discovered until some one invents an inoculation which will eliminate human selfishness and greed.
