## HUGE LAND PLANE MAY BRING CHEAP EXPRESS FREIGHT

DESSAU, Germany, June 25—The world's largest land plane, the Junkers G-38, will be put to work as a German freighter. Designed to carry 42 passengers, a crew of seven, and 6,600 pounds of cargo, the giant monoplane has been groomed for service on commercial air trails by its first cross-country flights.

The ship is seen by Prof. Hugo Junkers, its designer, as a realization of a problem on which he has worked for 20 years, economical and dependable air transportation of large loads over long distances. Surpassed in size only by the Dornier flying boat, DO-X, the freighter is an approximation of the ideal "flying wing." Its four motors are built into the single wing which is accessible almost to the extreme tips. Aside from two cabins in the fuselage, passengers, pilot room and cargo and fuel spaces are located in the all-metal wing. The engines are accessible from within for servicing during flight. ground, a landing gear of two wheels mounted in tandem on each side represents a new departure. A telegraphic device allows the pilot, who is relieved of the care of the power plant, to communicate with the chief mechanic. The ship is of all-metal construction and has a cruising speed of 105 miles an hour. Its wing spread is 144.35 feet, less than 14 feet shorter than the span of the DO-X.

## SEES IDEALISTIC TREND ATTITUDE FRENCH THOUGHT

PARIS, June 25—So-called high-brows are giving France a new conception of its mass mind. In the opinion of many French literary men and women the nation is going through the period of political idealism which is an aftermath of the cerebral bonfire which raged a hundred years ago and produced the movement known as "romanticism". The hundredth anniversary of the "romantics" reaches its climax with 1930.

The 1930 romantics, according to the modern literati, are political leaders who express their romanticism in terms of the proposed United States of Europe, the Treaty of Locarno, the Briand-Kellogg Pact and the London Naval Conference. Romanticism of 1830 was a literary movement which produced Hugo,

Balzac, Stendahl, Prosper Merimee, Lamartine and half a dozen other great writing men. It influenced art and political thought both in France and abroad.

Ernest Gaubert, author and well-known literary critic writing in the newspaper "Quotidien", sums up the 1830 romantic movement as a period when France thought beyond its own borders and visualized humanity as a whole. French political leaders and writers today are agreed on the whole that the present period of pride is one of political striving after new

ideals of human relationships. After political thought and activities show a tendency to broaden in scope and ideals, contemporary French literature, it is generally agreed, is peculiarly introspective and nationalistic in character. Commenting on it Gaubert says: "In the year 1830 there was an explosion of intellectual life and a wealth of artistic vigor which astounds us, accustomed as we are, unfortunately, to such little dreams and petty
