Liberal Family Quarrel Over Exhibition Grants Takes Up Time Of House

Premier MacMillan's Announcement Of Proposed Introduction Of Marketing Board And Easier Farm Credits Legislation Effectively Answers Opposition Criticism Of Alleged Neglect Of Agricultural Interests.

What Mr. J. A. Campbell (Liberal, Fourth Kings) described as a "family quarrel" occurred between Liberal members in the Legislature last week when the Agricultural estimates were in committee, and took up a good deal of the time of the House which might have been expended to better purpose.

Of chief interest, however, was the intimation given by Premier MacMillan of the proposed introduction of legislation to establish a Farm Marketing Board and easier farm credits, the Premier in this connection answering Opposition criticism that the Government was "doing nothing" in the interests of the agricultural population.

Speaking on the item Exhibition Grants and Livestock Marketing (9:15) Mr. L. R. Allen said that Summerville has reorganized for exhibition purposes and they desire to obtain government assistance.

Exhibition Grants Hon. Mr. Sharp pointed out that when the Summerville grant was still in existence, the management of the Prince County exhibition at Summerville decided to discontinue the exhibition. Opposes LePage Suggestion

Mr. T. A. Campbell did not agree with Mr. LePage's suggestion that the Government should restrict the rate of interest to five per cent.

West vs. East

Farmers' Legislation

Premier MacMillan: I am now saying he was in the employ of the Government. He came here for that specific purpose, of enlightening the farmers, and it was not the first time he was brought here. Urges Co-operative Marketing

Mr. Montague Anner (Lib., Fourth Kings) said he did not think agriculture had received as much attention as it should. In some cases old farms were found deserted and the land was growing up with bushes. The Province is capable of supporting two or three million people. The Department could assist very materially in educating young men and encouraging them in their work.
