L. C. R. CALENDARS TASTEFUL AND ARTISTIC.

The Intercolonial Railway calendar for 1912 is as usual tasteful and artistic. On a background which is a capital representation of walrus hide, there is a finely toned picture of the famous Maritime Express speeding through a scene that is typical of the summer loveliness of the Intercolonial Route. The emblematic moosehead appears at the top enclosed in a circle of scarlet. The lettering below is plain and neat, the words "Intercolonial Railway" standing out prominently in snowy whiteness, while the balance of the descriptive wording is tastefully shaded to harmonize with the background of light brown leather. The tab is of a chocolate color with plain figures in white that can be easily read. Thus the calendar is highly useful as well as distinctly ornamental, and should be eagerly sought for as a souvenir. CANADES GREAT FOREST RESERVE

OTTAWA, Feb. 1.—Following on the recommendations of the conservation commission, the government has approved and will shortly carry into effect the setting aside of an appropriation of \$110,000 to be expended this year on the new Rocky Mountain forest reserve.

The minister of the interior has decided to appoint a forestry expert, a trained man, with a scientific and practical knowledge of the work, to take charge of the reserve. As the latter is a tract 800 miles long and anywhere from thirty to sixty miles wide, or about 30,000 square miles in all, a staff of some proportions will be needed, particularly for the preliminary work.

The \$110,000 appropriation will be used in making trails, establishing stations, installing a telephone system, and endeavoring to prevent the possibility of fires in the huge reserve. The question is whether the reserve should be made a game preserve as well as come up. It is likely that a part, but not the whole of the segregated section, will be set apart for the preservation of Canadian animal life.

PLANTING DYNAMITE IN LAWRENCE, MASS.

LAWRENCE, Feb. 3.—On the charged counts in the conspiracy in connection with the alleged "planting" of dynamite in the home of the textile strikers by J. Breen, under-taker, a member of the Lawrence School Committee, was bound over to the Grand Jury after a hearing in the Police Court. He furnished bail in the sum \$1,000 on each count.

Seven other persons, who were arrested when the police detectives made their descent upon the Foreign Quarter and found several packages of dynamite were released.

A meeting was held this week at Pinette with reference to dredging Pinette, bar next spring. There is an excellent channel here which was greatly improved by the dredging done in 1909 by the dredge Montague. The work however started by the late Government was not completed. A cut of 125 feet in breadth had been ordered, but only a strip of 65 feet was made. The people of Pinette are very anxious that this work begun then should be thoroughly completed. This harbor as a refuge for vessels coming from a southerly direction is undoubtedly one of the very best. It has also excellent loading facilities and if the work of dredging the bar is only completed it will be one of the best ports in Prince Edward Island.

ANTIGONISH, Jan. 31.—There will be no contest for the Mayorality this year. Dugald McIsaac, the present Mayor, is re-nominated. There will be a spirited contest in the three vacancies for the office of Councillors, four candidates being in the field. They are Angus McGillivray, merchant; Joseph A. Wall, barrister; D.A. Macdonald, salesman; and Peter Macdonald, carriage-maker. Mr. Wall has a re-nomination.

EIGHT MINERS DROP 200 FEET IN CAGE

DANVILLE, Ill., Feb. 1.—A cage containing eight miners dropped 200 feet to the bottom of the shaft of the Electric Mine, six miles west of Danville, to-day. All of them were severely injured. The accident occurred while the night and day forces were being shifted.

MACK PREDICTS BIG CONVENTION

NEW YORK, Feb. 1.—Norman E. Mack, chairman of the Democratic national committee, said that the committee on arrangements for the annual convention would meet in Baltimore, Monday morning. Indications were, he said, that the attendance at the convention, would be the largest in the history of the party, as Democrats were more confident of victory this year than ever before.

FOR OWNERSHIP BY GOVERNMENT.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—Victor L. Berger, the socialist representative from Wisconsin, today introduced a bill in the House which provides that the United States Government shall condemn, acquire and operate railroads, telegraphs, telephone and interstate commerce.

NAT GOODWIN AS A WITNESS.

NEW YORK, Feb. 1.—Nat Goodwin, the actor, is here to testify for the defence at the trial of George Urahm Rice, B. H. Schefels and other mining stock promoters, charged with using the mails to defraud. Goodwin denied with more or less earnestness a report that he was going to marry a "society belle." Asked if he intended trying another matrimonial venture, he said: "You never can tell."

CAPTAIN KILLED IN SHIP CRASH

DOVER, England, Feb. 1.—The steamship Glendower was sunk, with the loss of her captain, in a collision with the British ship King Savannah today.

COX ACCUSED IN BANK SUIT.

CINCINNATI, O., Feb. 1.—Suit charging that the Republican boss, George B. Cox, and the directors and officers of the Cincinnati Trust Company fraudulently misused, misappropriated and misapplied almost a million dollars, the funds of the Cincinnati Trust Company, of which Cox was president, for their individual use and gain, and asking an accounting and a receiver for the assets, was filed today in Common Pleas Court.

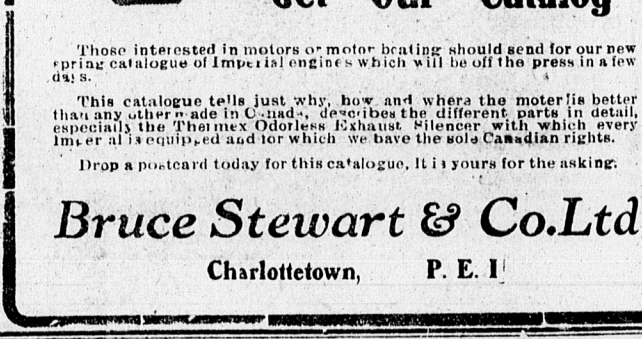
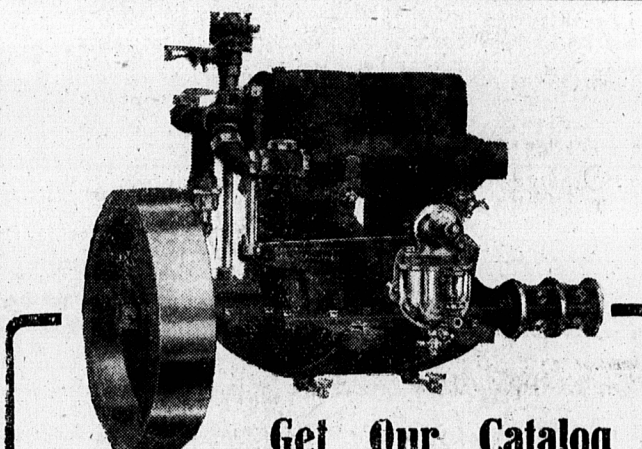
