The latest news, first of all.

The Arena Bowling Alleys will open this evening.

Dr J. C. Collins, Vernon River was in the city Saturday.

R. J. McKenzie, Dundas Centre, was in the city Saturday.

Judge McLeod, Summerside, was a passenger west Saturday morning.

A. N. McKay, City, left for St. John on a business trip Saturday morning.

A. A. Lefurgey, Summerside, returned home Saturday afternoon after attending the Grand Lodge A. F. and A. M. in this city.

Misses Wilson and Wackin, of Washington, D. C., arrived in the city on Friday night and will spend three months in this province.

Mr Stewart of the firm of Sinclair and Stewart, Ltd, Summerside, was a passenger west Saturday morning after a visit to this city.

It is regretted that owing to the rush in going to press an article on the Coma Murder Mystery was overlooked and appeared in Saturday's Guardian without being proof read, and was in a sadly mixed-up condition.

At the Police Court in this city Saturday the prohibition case against Mrs Mary Jane McMillan, for fourth offence was adjourned again until Saturday night, as was also the case against Mrs Mary McFarlane, Royalty for first offence.

The militia of Prince Edward Island will go into camp tomorrow on the usual ground, the artillery and infantry at Brighton and the Light Horse on the Exhibition Grounds. About 600 men will be under canvas. The Army Medical Corps will go to Sussex and the other corps will be up to their full strength as they were prior to last year when there was a reduction in the number.

Col. G. D. S. A. will be Camp Commandant. Major Weeks will be Brigade Major. Instead of Capt. Watts, Major Bartlett will be Paymaster, or and Col. H. D. Johnson, Principal Medical Officer. Besides Major McLaughlin, M. D., who will be in command of the corps, Captain Walker, Lieutenants Dr. Leckwell, Charlottetown, Dr. J. C. MacDonald, York, and Dr. Lawson, of St. Louis, will attend the A. M. C. camp at Sussex.

The following report from Mr. Allison, Sackville, will be of interest here: An exchange says: "Prof. Beaumont, who during the last couple of years was Assistant Director in the musical department at the Ladies' College, has resigned and his position has been offered to a young Englishman named Pickard, a qualified accomplished organist, a qualification which Dr. Jordan has had especially in mind in making the offer inasmuch as in the future he proposes to make more of a specialty of organ music than heretofore."

Miss Florence Vroom, long the capable and popular housekeeper at the Ladies' College, has also tendered her resignation. Professor Horsfall, the Head Director of the musical department is in New York, taking a course of lessons from "Josely." Miss Rugeley who was on the musical staff of the Ladies' College, last year, was married last week, at her home, Wakefield, Mass., to Robert Straling, of St. John, who recently graduated from the B. A. course at the university.

Rev Thos Pierce, Florenceville, N. B., formerly of this Province, has just closed a four year's pastorate on the Florenceville circuit. At the last meeting of the quarterly board, the affairs of the circuit were found in a most satisfactory condition. All the funds of the circuit were in advance of any previous year. During the present pastorate a parsonage has been built at a cost of upwards of \$3,200. After the balance from the parsonage Aid Fund is received there will be a remaining indebtedness of a little over \$800. In addition over \$200 worth of furnishings, etc., has been put in the parsonage. The estimated receipts of the circuit have been advanced one hundred dollars during the four years. About 100 have been received into membership of the church during the past year.

On Wednesday, June 23, the lowest branch of the W. M. Society spent a pleasant evening at the parsonage, and at the close presented Mrs Pierce with a gold piece, as a token of appreciation of her valuable aid, after which ice-cream and other refreshments were served.

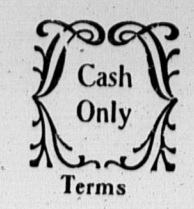
