Crop Report

Below will be found a brief synopsis of telegraphic reports received at the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal from its Branches. The Branch Managers have complete and intimate knowledge of each local situation and are in close touch with crop conditions in all sections of the districts mentioned.

General

Crop conditions in Western Canada continue to be satisfactory. Dry, windy weather appears to be all that is needed to ensure a remarkable yield in practically every part of the Prairie Provinces. There have been some hail storms but the damage has not been extensive except in certain comparatively small districts. Crop conditions in the other Provinces are exceptionally good on the whole. Details follow:

Prairie Provinces

EDMONTON DISTRICT: conditions continue satisfactory. **CALGARY DISTRICT:** prospects encouraging, but moisture needed at Brooks. Further severe hail damage at Okotoks and High River. **LETHBRIDGE DISTRICT:** crops making good progress. Sufficient moisture. Some slight hail damage. Hay crop heavy, quality not good. **SASKATOON DISTRICT:** crop conditions satisfactory with little damage reported from hail, although storms numerous. Wheat heading out but drying weather needed to avoid the rust of which there are indications in some districts. Hay and pasture good. **REGINA DISTRICT:** prospects generally continue favourable and a large percentage of wheat is headed out. Rust has appeared in some districts. Dry windy weather essential. Hail has caused some damage but to extent not known. Hay crop good but too wet to cut. Pasture plentiful. **WINNIPEG DISTRICT:** conditions favourable for good crops of both wheat and coarse grain. No serious damage to wheat yet reported. 70% of wheat is headed out. Pasture in bloom. Rye cutting began in some fields not heavy. Pasture good.

Province of Quebec
An average grain crop generally expected. Corn in the lower St. Lawrence district has a fine appearance and is doing well. Hay is being cut in some districts. Rye is heading out favourably. Small potatoes and summer crops in good condition.

Province of Ontario

Ideal growing weather. Crop maturing rapidly. Fall wheat cutting has commenced in some sections and a good crop is expected. Hay is practically all cut and a bountiful crop reported. Spring wheat beginning to head out. Barley, oats and peas give promise of good yield. Corn in excellent condition and will be a big crop. Fruits, cherries and plums a good crop. Pastures in excellent condition.

Maritime Provinces

In Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island all crops are progressing favourably, hay and fruit looking especially well. In New Brunswick grass pasture is heavy while hay and potato crop will be light. Recent rains however are having a beneficial effect.

Province of British Columbia.
Under favourable weather conditions all crops are making good progress. A good first crop of hay has been cut. Grains, potatoes and roots doing well. In the Okanagan Valley all varieties of fruit are sizing well and should harvest the best fruit in the valley's experience. Pasture is everywhere good.

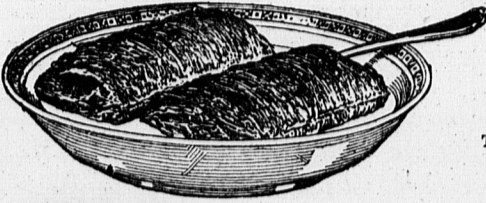

SWEDISH GENERALS OPPOSE REDUCING NATIONAL ARMY

STOCKHOLM, July 20. Swedish membership in the League of Nations has not eliminated the necessity of effective preparations for war, and the plan for a drastic reduction of the Swedish army,

recently recommended by the Swedish Delegation Review Committee, does not provide such preparation. This is the official opinion of the commission of 18 Swedish generals, after a recent conference. In case of attack Sweden is to receive armed assistance from other members of the League, but until such assistance arrives, it was pointed out, the country must be prepared to resist the first shock. Furthermore, Sweden might, in some other case, be called to render military assistance. It was argued, as for instance, if Finland were attacked by Russia.

The commission of Swedish generals urges the maintenance of the present number of army units, together with the retention of general compulsory service. It recommends that every conscript

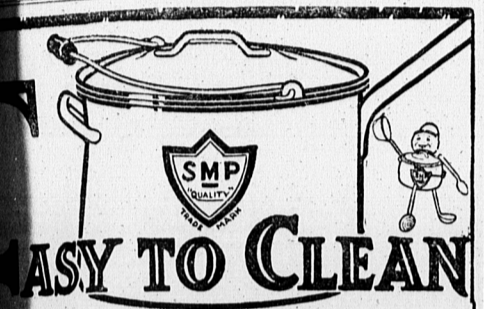

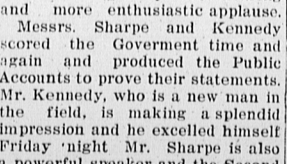
