Latest from Summerside and
Prince County.

The Stanley made little progress yesterday and was visible from Summerside during the day. She changed her position somewhat but remained for the night in about the same place as on the previous night.

The town accounts are in the hands of the publishers and will be distributed to the rate payers in course of a few days, after which the Mayor will call a public meeting of the citizens for the purpose of discussing civic affairs.

The first failure of the Stanley on account of ice to make the trip to Cape Tormentine last year was on January 14th on which day she returned to the wharf at 4 p. m. On the following day she reached Cape Tormentine at 4 p. m. and remained over night. On the next day January 16th she made the trip to Summerside in three hours. Good runs were made on the subsequent days until the 28th when the worst ice jam of the season was experienced lasting several days.

SUPREME COURT.

The Hilary term of the Supreme Court opened yesterday morning in Charlottetown, Chief Justice Sullivan presiding. Heartz, City; James Stevenson, Fredericton.

On motion of Mr W A O Morson, K C an order was made for the examination of Charles G Duffy, preparatory to be admitted an attorney.

On motion of Mr Morson, K C, a similar order was made for examination as attorney-at-law, of Joseph S O'Neill, a student in the office of A A McLean, K C.

Neil McQuarrie, K C, moved for an order in for bail for George Gillian. Attorney General argued contra. The Court refuses to grant bail. George A Aitken, Deputy Prothonotary of the Supreme Court at Georgetown, was appointed a Commissioner for taking bail in King's County.

The Chief Justice in his charge to the Grand Jury, congratulated the country districts on their freedom from crime, as compared with the city. The manner in which the law was enforced was not creditable to the city authorities. He referred to the presence of saloons in Charlottetown.

In the afternoon the Grand Jury submitted their report and were discharged. It recommended a new location for the Jail and fire escapes for the Asylum.

A true bill for assault was found against William Power.
