CRAWFORD'S CASE AT CAMPBELLTON

CAMPBELLTON, Oct. 7.—The investigation of the charges against Chief Crawford of Campbellton, laid by W. P. Thompson, of St John, in reference to improper arrest of the said Thompson, commenced this evening. A large number of citizens were present. Most of the evening was taken up with the passages at arms between W. A. Mott, attorney for Mr Thompson, and others making charges. The proceedings were at times, warm and the investigation gives promise of being long drawn out.

The police committee composed of H. M. McLellan, chairman, and Councillors Richards and Mowat, are anxious to give all a fair hearing and that the investigation should not be unduly delayed. Among the charges laid against the chief is one that he sent exaggerated reports of police matters to the St John papers which were detrimental to the interest of the town.

The Mann & Baxter failure is the chief topic on the streets here and it is impossible at present to form an accurate estimate of this firm's liability. A meeting of the creditors is called for Monday next at 2 o'clock. It is stated that the liabilities will exceed \$30,000 and the assets are thought to be very small, as everything is covered by mortgage. Messrs. Mann and Baxter had under way a large number of residences for private parties and, in many cases, the full amount due for the work was paid and they will also be obliged to satisfy mechanics' and other liens thereupon.

TORONTO STOCK FIRM FAILED

TORONTO, Oct. 7.—Today saw the suspension of the stock brokerage firm of Wyatt & Co., a failure which means a loss to customers, loan companies, etc., of from \$100,000 to \$200,000, and which involves the accounts of seventy-five of eighty customers.

The caused of the failure, it was learned on the best of authority, is the fact that the firm was from 2,000 to 4,000 shares of stock short, mostly in New York securities. While a proportion of these would represent

BOSTON, Mass., Oct 6.—The Boston residence of Governor Ben S. Draper, 10 Beacon Street, in the Back Bay section of this city was practically reduced to ashes by fire early today. A conservative estimate of the loss places it at \$100,000.

No one was in the house at the time, the Governor and his family not having returned from their Hopedale home. George Waggett, a fireman, was partially overcome by smoke. It is believed the fire started in the basement, possibly through the careless use of matches by workmen who were preparing the house for occupancy.
