The latest news, first of all.

Montague dealers are paying 42 cents a bus for oats, 22 to 25 cents a bus for potatoes, 22 cents a lb for butter, 21 cents a doz for eggs, \$10 a ton for loose hay and 9 cents a lb for pork.

J. M. Clark, Summerside has secured the contract of the erection of a building at Priest Pond, King's County. It will be used by the Marine Department as a rocket apparatus building. Work will start on it next week. This makes five contracts which Mr. Clark has handled since last spring, four of which will be completed in a few days. He built an addition to the railway wharf at Souris, a fog alarm keeper's house on Pan ure Island, the big smoke stack for Falconwood Hospital and a very large freight shed on the railway wharf, Charlottetown.

The City of Ghent arrived in Summerside last evening.

Many in Summerside yesterday expressed the opinion that something should be done to regulate the length of hat pins worn by the ladies. Monday night while in the post office a middle aged citizen called with a hat containing one of those concealed weapons and received a severe gash in his cheek from which the blood flowed freely.

G. M. Price, one mile east of Summerside, is seriously ill. Being past 80 years of age little hope is entertained of his recovery.

In Summerside yesterday dealers were paying twenty two to twenty three cents a dozen for eggs; eight dollars and fifty cents a ton for loose hay, four dollars and fifty cents for straw; twenty to twenty five cents per bus for potatoes; forty to forty one cents per bus for oats and eight to eight and three quarter cents per lb for pork.

The I. O. F. Demonstration at Alberton, Monday evening last, was a great success in every way. The attendance was good. The Ladies' Band, under the conductorship of Dr Purdy, rendered very efficient service and was most heartily congratulated by visiting brethren. Readings by Fred Rogers, songs by Miss Meggison and L. and F. Laird were much appreciated. Addresses by H. C. R., Rev E. J. Rattee, and Dr Ross, made a very interesting program. THE HESTIA WRECK.

OTTAWA, Nov. 23—The wreck of the Hestia in the North Bay of Fundy was subject of a discussion in Parliament yesterday. The Department of Marine was attacked by Dr Daniel, Mr Crockett and Mr Borden for allowing the old Proprietor Buoy to remain unlighted for almost ten months. They further charged that the Shipping World had not received a proper notification of the continuance of buoy in an unlighted condition.

Mr Brodeur, Minister of Marine, defended the Department, claiming that the buoy was not an essential aid to navigation, that there were other lights in the vicinity, and that there had been sufficient notice that the light was out. The Minister promised a further enquiry.

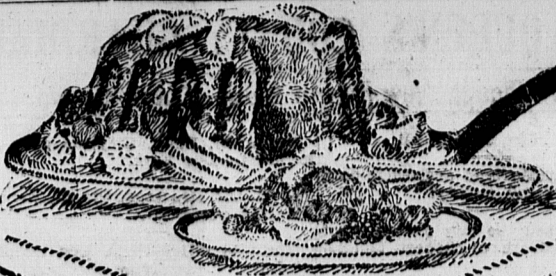

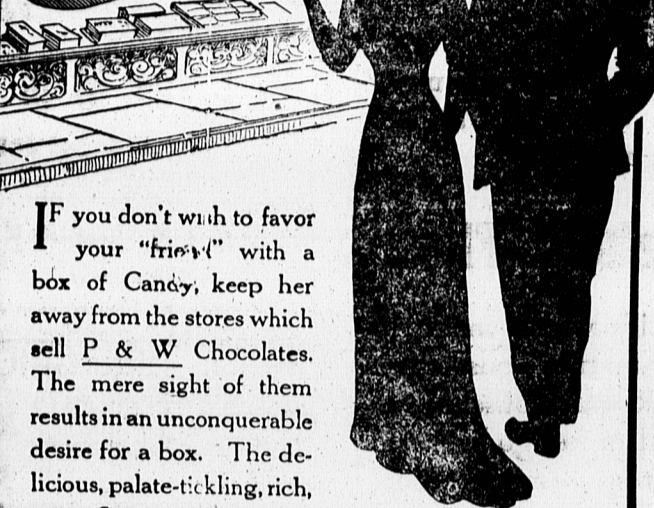
