FISH AND GAME PROTECTION.

It would appear from a published letter of President F. W. Hyndman of the P. E. Island Fish and Game Association, that notwithstanding the educational meetings held by Secretary Carbonell a good deal of prejudice and misapprehension exists with regard to the powers, aims and objects of the organization referred to.

It is most desirable that such illusions should be dispelled, the more especially as some local organizations are said to have been formed in opposition to the parent 'Association.' In the first place the prime object of the organization is the protection of the fish and game of the Island from depletion and destruction which now threatens it.

It is to be observed also that similar organizations for the protection of fish and game exist in almost every Province of Canada. That formed here is in no respect local, but extends to the entire Island, nor is it designed to give special privileges to any section, class or creed. And nothing that the Association desires to do or can do will limit the right of any property owner to fish or shoot on his

own property provided he does so within times specified and according to the terms prescribed by law.

Of course, when a close season is ordered, as, for instance, in order to enable partridges or other game birds to rear their broods and increase their numbers, all must refrain from shooting until the time limit expires. There is nothing new in this. It is a principle recognized in this Province now, as it is in all civilized lands. Moreover the enactment of any new provisions rests with the Legislature in which the country districts are so overwhelmingly represented that their local interests will, it is needless to say, be zealously guarded.

Every one ought to feel an interest in the preservation of our fish and game, and in order that these may be preserved, regulations are necessary for the punishment of those who fish or shoot in unlawful times or who kill fish or game in an unlawful manner. It is safe to say that the Legislature will impose no new restrictions other than those necessary to secure the one prime object of preservation.

Mr. Hyndman tells that the Association is entirely opposed to leasing fishing or shooting rights to any person or persons, to the exclusion of others in this Province. We have not yet reached the stage, and we trust the time may never come when our own people shall be shut out and our fish and game privileges be made the preserve of moneyed sportsmen either from abroad or from any populous center of this Province.

As we have said, the Association has no power to impose any tax, but only to make suggestions to the Legislature. The Association proposes to ask for legislation imposing a small license fee for residents and a much larger one for non-residents for the privilege of killing game, and that the amount of these fees shall be wholly expended by the Government in enforcing the game laws.

This has been done elsewhere, and under proper safe guards, such as the Legislature will no doubt, prescribe, we see no reason why the present conditions may not be greatly improved. We cannot go on as we have been going without being left presently with very little fish or game to protect. It is therefore in the interest of all that more conserving measures shall be adopted and that without delay.

The Imperial House of Commons is composed of 670 members, while the body of the chamber in which they meet has seats for no more than 400, that is 200 to the right and a like number to the left of the Speaker. The galleries above accommodate something less than 200. But no member is permitted to make a speech from the gallery. This would seem to us in Canada to be but very poor accommodation for the greatest deliberative assembly in the world. On this side the water every individual member has a seat and a desk of his own. At Westminster, in a Parliament building which cost millions, no member has a seat which he can call his own, even by courtesy, except the Ministers and the Opposition leader. First come first served is the rule and there are not nearly enough seats for all.

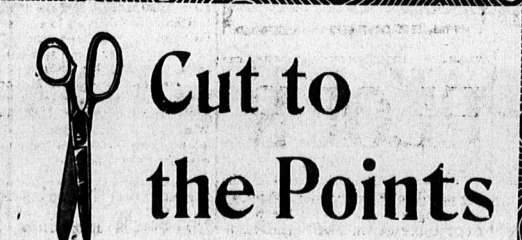
