Findlay Case Is Adjourned

HALIFAX, Dec. 15—(CP)—Preliminary hearing of Allan Findlay, youthful law school lecturer charged with attempting to communicate information about military and naval movements in the Halifax district, was adjourned for one week today.

The adjournment was granted by Magistrate R. E. Inglis at the request of Eugene T. Parker who appeared for the prosecution, whose counsel, J. Gordon Fogo, is out of town. Proceedings took only about a minute and bail of \$5,000 was renewed.

Findlay is accused by Royal Canadian Mounted Police of attempting to forward the information to Bodil Knuif of Copenhagen.

CHICAGO, Dec. 17—(AP)—Renewed heavy buying, which for almost three weeks has been skyrocketing wheat values, gave the market another sharp advance today, establishing new high prices for the past two years.

Closing prices were at the day's highs or 3 1/4-3 7/8 higher, with Dec at 1.06 7/8-1.07, and May 1.05-1.05 1/4. Buying spread to other pits and corn closed 5-8-1 3/8 up, Dec 56 1-4; May 58 1-8-1-4; Oats 1-4-1-2 up; Soy Beans 4-4 3/4 higher and rye 3 3/8-4 1/8 higher.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 17—(CP)—Wheat futures prices soared to new seasonal highs and their best since July, 1938, during Saturday's short session on Winnipeg grain exchange as buyers responded to a buoyant disloyal at Chicago.

Final quotations were 1 3/4-2 cents higher, Dec wheat at 84 7-8 cents a bushel, May 89-89 1-8 and July 90-90 1-8. Buenos Aires values closed 1-8 cent higher to 5-8 lower.

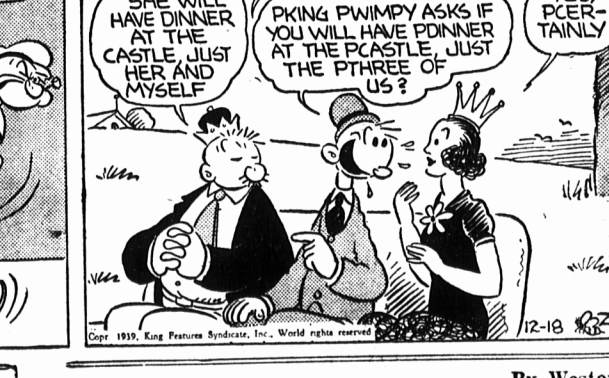
