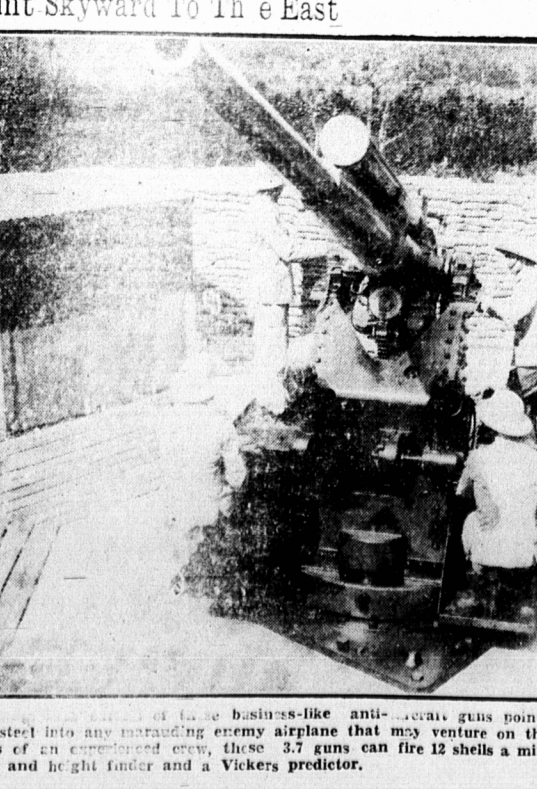

\$400 Annual Income For Ten Million Unemployed

\$4,000 Home For One Million Families

Twenty Highways Across The U. S. At \$50,000 per Mile

Fifty thousand dollars a mile will build a magnificent highway. It is far in excess of the cost of the average. Yet the four billions of dollars would build twenty highways, at a cost of \$50,000 per mile, across the United States, with \$125,000,000 left over for connecting links. And if the money were not spent for liquor, those highways would be vastly safer.

Six Million Dollar Endowment For 625 Colleges

There are six hundred and twenty-six colleges and universities in the United States, of recognized academic standing. A very large number of them face the prospect of a critical financial problem. At least one hundred of them may be compelled to go out of business in the next five years. In some cases it would cost no more than a quarter of a million to save them. But if we could use the nation's expenditures for alcohol for these institutions, we could give every one of them an endowment of \$6,000,000, which would guarantee its work for all the years to come and there would be \$244,000,000 left over with which to endow chairs and four high grade professors to the faculty of every one of the colleges and provide for their salaries for all time.

Community Chests For 1,200 Cities

The annual community chest campaign in the average city is an anxious period. A vast amount of community service is dependent upon the question, "Will they raise it?" In the city of Los Angeles, the fifth city in the United States, the amount asked is \$3,000,000 which represents a minimum for operating the nearly one hundred agencies. Raising this amount is always a gigantic task. Yet the annual drink bill of the nation would provide a \$6,000,000 community chest fund (twice the present amount) for each of the fifty largest cities of America, a \$3,000,000 chest for the next fifty, a \$1,000,000 chest for the next one hundred, and a \$200,000 chest for the next one thousand cities of America.

\$100,000 For 5,000 Hospitals For Free Service Build 1,000 \$250,000 Hospitals and \$250,000 Endowment For Each

In addition, the drink bill would provide five thousand hospitals with a sum of \$100,000 for free work among the poor, and would erect a public hospital at a cost of \$250,000 and provide for \$250,000 endowment, in each of one thousand American towns. Also in addition it would provide a \$100,000 playground and endow it with a fund of \$200,000 for perpetual care in each of one thousand American communities.

Pay Entire Bill Of Army and Navy, Build and equip 2,000 Public Libraries

Having done all this it would still pay for the entire bill of the American army and navy, and have enough left over to pay the salary of the president of the United States.

CLEAN BOTTOM HAS MANY FEATURES OF LAND AREAS

Oceanologists declare there is a world below the world as we ordinarily know it, according to the Canadian National Telegraph, whose cable connections reach all continents of the earth. Aside from the topography of the ocean bottom shows that it has mountains, valleys and plains.

The greatest depth recorded in the Atlantic is 4,662 fathoms (more than 5 1/4 miles) in what is known as the "Nares Deep" to the north of the West Indies. There are many of these "deeps" in the sea and they all bear distinctive names. To avoid laying cable in the deeper of these valleys, cable engineers have followed a course across the North Atlantic extending from the Grand Banks of Newfoundland, across the "telegraphic plateau" to Valentia in Ireland and Penzance of Gilbert and Sullivan fame - on the southernmost tip of England.
