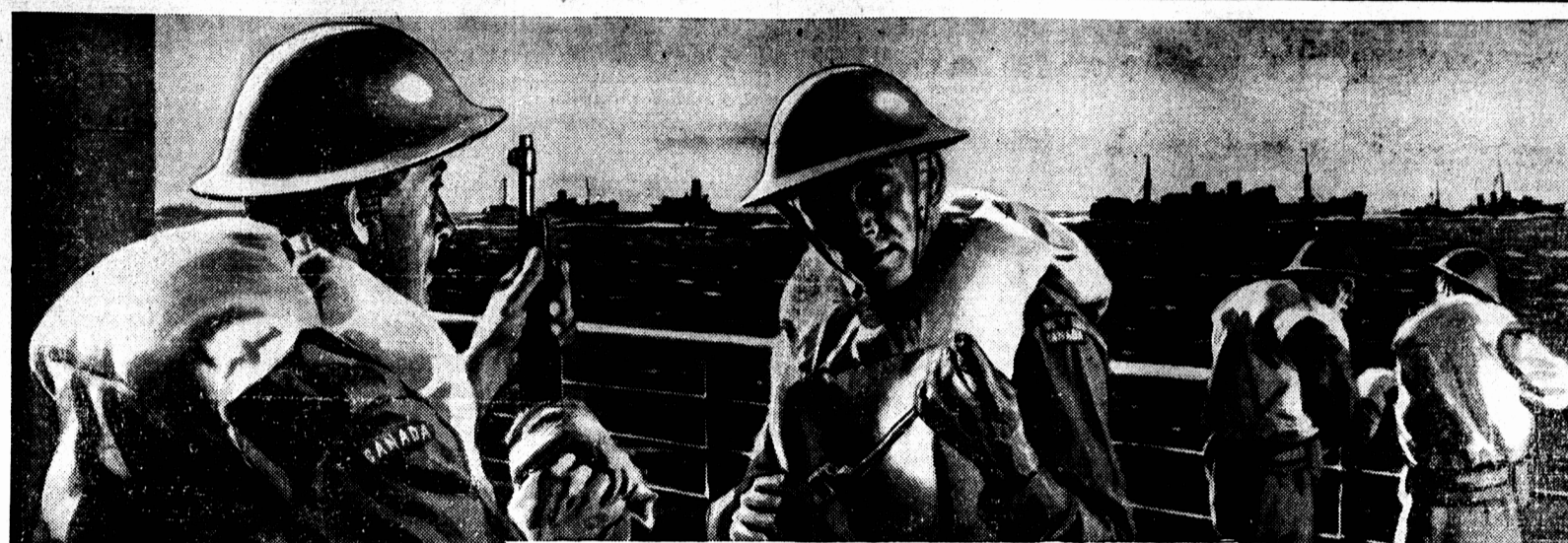

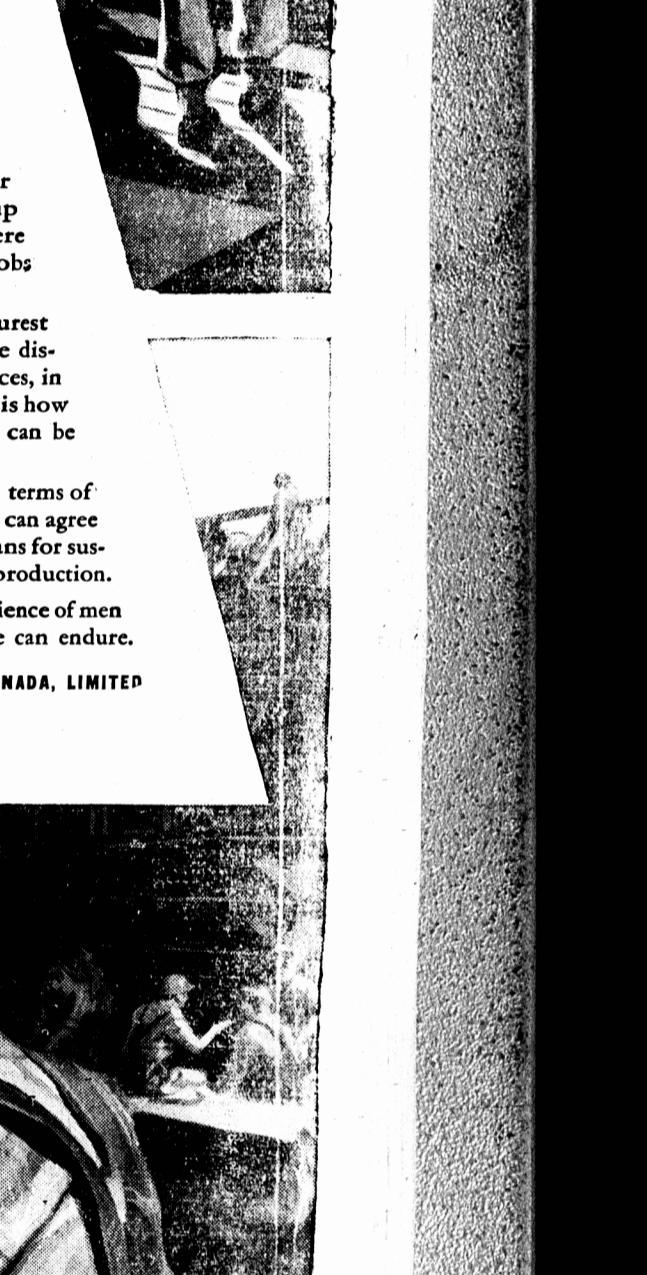

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN IN NORTHERN CAMP

MELBOURNE, Oct. 16—(CP)—When the advance guard of Australian Women's Army Service went north, they slept for the first few weeks on the ground. They had a waterproof sheet and three blankets each and gunnies for overcoats.

The first night during the northern winter, they had a sunny night and got temperatures as low as 25 degrees. A Melbourne girl said:

"It was just like home to me, but the Queenslanders shivered. The girls didn't mind the discomfort. They were attached to an A.I.P. unit which had served in the Middle East, and realized their hardships were mild to what the boys went through. The A.W.A.S. are now comfortably housed in Army huts. They are in a combat zone, and as such, in addition to a long training, signals, intelligence, stores, quartermaster and movements. There are some drivers, and five of the A.I.P. officers' messes in the area have A.W.A.S. cooks kitchen orderlies."

The A.W.A.S. troops sleep in large dormitory with an A.W.S. sergeant in charge of each. They have tropical beds with straw pallets, a pillow, and the straw issue of three blankets. A newer type of hut is being planned for A.W.A.S. in tropical areas. The hut will be partitioned inside, with two girls to each cubicle.

Until such time as the dormitories are equipped according to standard regulations, the A.W.A.S. devise their own means of packing cupboards and wardrobes. They hang their clothes on lengths of piping or ropes. Bedside tables are ferns and packing cases padded and draped with chintz and dyed sugar bags. And always there are numerous pictures of the home folk, of brothers, fiancés and husbands hanging in the uniforms of the fighting forces.
