A Message for Christmas

Mr. P. M. Draper, Secretary-Treasurer of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, Urges All Canadians To Do What They Are Able To Contribute To The Well-Being of Others And To Look Forward With Hope To The Day When The Festive Season May Be Described As A Right Merry One.

Mr. P. M. Draper, secretary-treasurer of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, greets his fellow-Canadians and co-workers in an annual Christmas message which strikes a note of hope and encouragement for the future, despite the present conditions. Mr. Draper's message reads: The year 1933 is rapidly drawing to a close. Before we embark upon 1934, however, there will intervene that joyous season of Christmas which is so universally observed throughout our Dominion. As this time each of us not only wishes to enjoy some respite from the thoughts and concerns of the work-a-day world, but each likes to feel that his fellow men are likewise in a position to experience the pleasure of a brief relaxation from every day trials and from the uncertainties which characterize our existence. To anyone who gives any thought to such matters, the forthcoming Christmas season is bound to be shadowed by the dark clouds of depression which still are hanging over most of the world. Last year and the year before, while not collisions to the serious economic plight of a great number of our fellow Canadians, we looked forward to a New Year hopefully, praying that the evils which then afflicted Canada might be dispensed by better times to come in the year when starting. This year we will likewise do so, though after repeated disappointments one must necessarily be more cautious in his outlook. General business conditions, it is true, show some slight signs of improvement, not particularly important in themselves, in so far as aiding the unemployed to earn a living is concerned, but of some importance as indicating better tendencies if only the improvements to date may prove to be the forerunner of the better times so ardently hoped for. The New Year is bound to carry with it the same or similar problems which we experienced during 1933. Those connected with the Labor Movement must expect that their full energies will be required again to assist in mitigating the evil effects of widespread unemployment and to the end that the curse of unemployment may be mastered by the human race. Public relief on an unprecedented scale as now distributed indicates a humanitarian outlook on the part of governments and the public which has not been a factor until very recent times. But surely with the awakening of such a humanitarian consciousness it should be possible to direct the intellectual energies of the nation towards a solution of the problem of unemployment. In extending my very best wishes for a Happy Christmas and a year of more abundant blessings, I should like to add that the most practical method of thoroughly enjoying the festive season of 1933-34 is to resolve to contribute in whatever degree may be possible to the well-being of any less fortunate situated than the rest, that the day may come in the not too distant future when the 25th of December will be a right Merry Christmas for all Canadians, without need for appreciation concerning the economic future.

NEWFOUNDLAND BILL GIVEN ROYAL ASSENT

Immediate Steps Taken For Restoration of Island by British Government.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—(G.P. Cable)—The British Government lost no time today in proceeding with its plans for putting Newfoundland back on its financial and economic feet. Not long after the Newfoundland bill, suspending Newfoundland's self-government and making Britain responsible until the island has been rehabilitated, had been given Royal Assent today the Treasury announced that tomorrow it would offer holders of Newfoundland Government stocks and bonds the opportunity to exchange them for British Government guaranteed bonds of the same denominations, at three per cent interest. The offer will be open for a month. It is expected that a total of the issues covered by the offer is around \$25,000,000. The new issue is in 10 and 20-year bonds. The British Government meanwhile is carefully seeking commissioners who will govern the island for the period necessary for its restoration, estimated at about three years. It has given assurance they will be selected by merit and political considerations will not enter into the appointments in any way.

A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE (By Dr. Dyson Hague, Toronto) "News!" said the angel. "News! I bring you good news! I bring you happy news! News direct from heaven! News of transcendent joy! A Child is born. For us this Son is given. That tiny Babe is the Saviour, the long-expected Christ, the Lord. The angel who spoke in the glory blaze of heaven that night may have been, say probably was, Gabriel. I love to think it was Gabriel because he was the angel who stood on the right of the altar of incense and spoke to old Zacharias the priest. You remember he said: 'I am Gabriel, I stand in the presence of God. I am sent to speak unto thee: thus show you these glad tidings.' Then six months later it was the angel Gabriel whom God sent to the Virgin Mary with the great Announcement: 'Hail, thou favoured one! Thou shalt bring forth a son. Thou shalt call His name Jesus. That Holy Thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.' (Luke 1:11-29) What incredible news! The world had never heard anything like it, and the world has never heard anything like it since. It announced the most wonderful event in the world's history. The birth of a Child. Every arrival of new soul in the world is a mystery, a sealed casket of possibilities. But the arrival of this Child was an event that blest history. Everything before is now known by the letters B.C. (before Christ). And everything since then by the great letters A.D. (anno Domini, in the year of our Lord.) When a child is born in a family there is often great joy in that family and its small circle. When a child is born to the royal family there is wider joy, an Empire rejoices. But when Christ was born it was a world event, it was good tidings of great joy to all the people in the world. That's what makes Christ's birth so wonderful. It was not a small, a limited, a transient or a temporal incident, but one touching eternal issues; a birth that was to affect the whole world, every race of men and the cycles of eternity. News? It was the most incredible, the most astonishing news. Not the news of our newspapers today with their messages from earth to earth. This was news from heaven to men. And more. It will always be news. Yes, to every soul in the world the first time there sweeps over the astonished consciousness the idea that in that Christ of history there is the power of His life today, the love of God, the joy of Christ, the light of life of a present Saviour. It is the revelation of a tremendous surprise. It's always good news. It's always glad tidings of great joy. Give us something fresh in the cry of this world, up-to-date, the latest word. Here it is. Listen! 'Unto you is born this day a Saviour Who is Christ the Lord.' Believe it. Receive it. Get it into your soul and to every soul in the world. Accept it and have will die in every fibre of your heart. Love will break out and irradiate your life. Then will your mouth be filled with laughter and your tongue with singing. Then will your hand be opened to give, and your eyes to look out for them you can bless. That narrow, nasty life of Scrooge the Selfish will vanish as the mist of dawn. Joy, great joy, real joy, deep joy, lasting joy will sweep into the soul. What the world needs today, this world of suffering, of poverty or sadness and of breaking hearts is Gabriel's happy news. NEW YORK, Dec. 21.—(A.P.)—The American Museum of Natural History announced today that Col. and Mrs. Charles A. Lindbergh had presented to the museum the airplane in which they completed their 33,000-mile aerial survey on Tuesday. The announcement was made at a conference at the museum attended by Colonel Lindbergh and Mrs. Lindbergh, F. Truette Davison, President of the Museum, and other officials. The plane, a Lockheed-built monoplane powered by a Wright whirling motor and equipped with pontoons, will be placed on exhibition Jan. 1 in the new hall of ocean.
