STRENGTHENING THE DEFENCES OF COAST MENACED BY GERMANY.

LONDON, May 12—Under a new scheme of defence, initiated by Winston Spencer Churchill, first lord of the British fleet commenced on May 1 a continuous patrol of the coasts of the United Kingdom. The north-east coast, menaced as it is by the powerful fleet of the German empire, is necessarily most closely guarded and there the most modern and powerful vessels of the mosquito fleet, supported by submarines, have been stationed. Heretofore the two battle squadrons of the home fleet

have had attached to them a destroyer flotilla, with reserve flotillas at the naval bases at Devonport Ports mouth and the Nore. The new scheme provides that no destroyers are to be permanently attached to the battle fleets. Instead, the whole available force has been organized into eight flotillas, four being in full commission and four in reserve with nucleus crews.
