'ELLIOT'S HORSE' IS NOW AT SALISBURY

LONDON, Nov. 24.—The eighty men who formed what was to be known as Elliot's Horse, who came to England from Western Canada and had many troubles on the way, not the least being that, according to their own story, they were brought to England under a complete delusion as to their standing when they reached here, have at last found asylum in the Canadian contingent at Salisbury Plains.

The men were sent down there on Thursday, and it is understood arrangements have been made whereby they will be drafted into different units of the division. This, of course, disposed of them as a unit of their own, but none of them will experience much regret upon that point, their chief desire being to get to the front.

LIFE BEYOND GRAVE SAYS SIR O. LODGE.

LONDON, Nov. 24.—Sir Oliver Lodge President of the Society for Psychical Research, in a lecture today in Browning Hall, Walworth, made a striking declaration of his spiritual faith, expressing his absolute conviction in a future existence, and stating that he had conversed with friends who had passed away.

"I say this," said Sir Oliver, "On definite scientific grounds; I say it because I know that certain friends of mine still exist, because I have talked to them. Communication is possible, but one must obey the laws to find out the conditions. I do not say it is easy but I say it is possible."

"I tell you that these people still take an interest in the things that are going on, that they still help us to know more about things than we do, and that they are able from time to time to communicate with us."

Sir Oliver said that once people realized that consciousness was something outside the mechanism it made use of, they realized the survival of existence was the simplest thing. It was unreasonable that the soul should pass out of existence when the body was destroyed. People were not limited to the few years they live on earth, and they certainly continued to exist.

A DIFFERENCE IN CROSSES.

In some respect the Iron Cross of Prussia, which the Kaiser is distributing with so lavish a hand, is similar to the Victoria Cross. Each is the reward for personal bravery on the battlefield, and each is in the form of a Maltese cross, our own famous honour is bronze, fashioned from cannon captured at Sebastopol, and the other in iron edged with silver. There the likeness ends, for whereas thousands of Prussian combatants have received the Iron Cross in the present campaign, the Victoria Cross has been presented to little more than 500 heroes since its establishment in 1856.

The Iron Cross was instituted in 1813 by Frederick Wilhelm III, of Prussia, the great-grandfather of the present Kaiser, to honor eminent services in the war against Napoleon.

CANADA PAYS OFF DEBT OVER EIGHT MILLIONS

OTTAWA, Nov. 24.—Hon. W. T. White, Minister of Finance, stated today that the Government had paid off in London Treasury bills amounting to £1,700,000 or \$8,500,000 maturing today. The Dominion Government has now no outstanding treasury bills and no loans maturing until 1919.

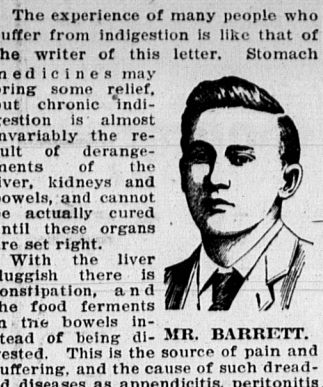
This is considered a particularly fortunate position, especially in view of present international money conditions. It means that no new loans will have to be floated to take care of maturing permanent loans which are usually of large amount. During the past three years maturing loans of this character aggregating over \$25,000,000 have been met.

A PLURALIST IN DUKEDOM.

All peers above the ranks of baron are pluralist in the matter of titles but the Duke of Buccleuch, who recently died, was a pluralist even in dukedoms. His forebears married the daughters and sisters of kings, and he himself was a lineal descendant of Charles II, to whom the family owed the highest title. Charles's sons, the Duke of Monmouth, married Anne Countess of Becluch, and on their wedding day Anne—the Duchess in "The Lay of the Last Minstrel"—persuaded Charles to make them Lord and Lady Scott of Whitchester, Earl and Countess of Dalkeith, and Duke and Duchess of Buccleuch. To the third duke came in 1706 another dukedom, that of Queensberry, and the late sixth, duke held them both, together with a marquise, four earldoms, three viscounties, and four or five baronies.

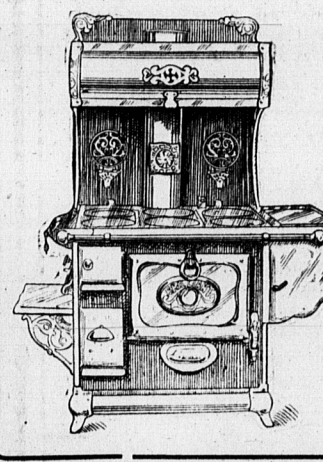
